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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. MANDATORY TESTING IN THE EVENT OF A COLLISION
18	RESULTING IN INJURY OR DEATH
19	A. A health care provider who is providing medical
20	care in a health care facility to a person involved in a motor
21	vehicle collision shall perform a blood or urine test on the
22	person to determine the content of alcohol or other drug or
23	intoxicating compound in the person's blood or urine.
24	B. A health care provider shall report to the state
25	police or to the local law enforcement agency the results of
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1	any tests performed pursuant to Subsection A of this section
2	if:
3	(1) the alcohol concentration in the person's
4	blood meets or exceeds the amounts specified in Section
5	66-8-102 NMSA 1978; or
6	(2) the person's blood or urine contains one
7	or more drugs that are capable of impairing a person's ability
8	to operate a vehicle in a careful and prudent manner.
9	C. The report by the health care provider shall
10	consist of the name of the person being treated, the blood
11	alcohol concentration or drug content disclosed by the test,
12	and the date and time of the administration of the test.
13	D. A health care provider or a health care facility
14	shall not be liable for civil damages or professional
15	discipline as a result of compliance with this section.
16	E. As used in this section:
17	(1) "health care facility" means any program,
18	institution, place, building or agency, private or public,
19	whether organized for profit or not, that is used, operated or
20	designed to provide medical diagnosis, treatment or
21	rehabilitative or preventive care and includes health care
22	facilities that are commonly referred to as hospitals,
23	outpatient clinics, organized ambulatory health care
24	facilities, emergency care facilities and centers, health
25	maintenance organizations and others providing similarly
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		1	organized services; and
		2	(2) "health care provider" means a person who
		3	is licensed, certified or otherwise authorized or permitted by
		4	law to administer health care in the ordinary course of
		5	business or practice of a profession.
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
