19	A. The state equalization guarantee distribution is			
20	that amount of money distributed to each school district to			
21	ensure that the school district's operating revenue, including			
22	its local and federal revenues as defined in this section, is			
23	at least equal to the school district's program cost.			
24	B. "Local revenue", as used in this section, means			
25	seventy-five percent of receipts to the school district derived

The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total revenue receipts for capital outlay.

C. "Federal revenue", as used in this section, means receipts to the school district, excluding amounts that, if taken into account in the computation of the state equalization guarantee distribution, result, under federal law or regulations, in a reduction in or elimination of federal school funding otherwise receivable by the school district, derived from the following:

(1) seventy-five percent of the school district's share of forest reserve funds distributed in accordance with Section 22-8-33 NMSA 1978. The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the total forest reserve receipts for capital outlay; and

(2) seventy-five percent of grants from thefederal government as assistance to those areas affected byfederal activity authorized in accordance with Title 20 of the. 156388.1

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1 United States Code, commonly known as "PL 874 funds" or "impact 2 aid". The school district shall budget and expend twenty percent of the grant receipts for capital outlay. A school 3 4 district that receives funds due to the school district being 5 affected by federal activity in the form of students who reside on Indian reservations or other tribal land shall not expend 6 7 the district's share of federal funds that come to the school 8 district as a result of that federal activity until the use of 9 the funds has been approved by the Indian education committee 10 in the local school district.

D. To determine the amount of the state equalization guarantee distribution, the state superintendent shall:

(1) calculate the number of program units to
which each school district is entitled using an average of the
MEM on the fortieth, eightieth and one hundred twentieth days
of the prior year; or

(2) calculate the number of program units to which a school district operating under an approved year-round school calendar is entitled using an average of the MEM on appropriate dates established by the state board; or

(3) calculate the number of program units to which a school district with a MEM of two hundred or less is entitled by using an average of the MEM on the fortieth, eightieth and one hundred twentieth days of the prior year or . 156388.1

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1 the fortieth day of the current year, whichever is greater; and 2 (4) using the results of the calculations in Paragraph (1), (2) or (3) of this subsection and the 3 instructional staff training and experience index from the 4 5 October report of the prior school year, establish a total 6 program cost of the school district; 7 calculate the local and federal revenues (5) as defined in this section: 8 9 (6)deduct the sum of the calculations made in 10 Paragraph (5) of this subsection from the program cost 11 established in Paragraph (4) of this subsection; and 12 (7) deduct the total amount of guaranteed 13 energy savings contract payments that the state superintendent 14 determines will be made to the school district from the public 15 school utility conservation fund during the fiscal year for 16 which the state equalization guarantee distribution is being 17 computed. 18 Е. The amount of the state equalization guarantee 19 distribution to which a school district is entitled is the 20 balance remaining after the deductions made in Paragraphs (6) 21 and (7) of Subsection D of this section. 22 The state equalization guarantee distribution F. 23 shall be distributed prior to June 30 of each fiscal year. The 24 calculation shall be based on the local and federal revenues 25 specified in this section received from June 1 of the previous . 156388. 1
