7	Section 1. Section 22-13-6.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
8	1994, Chapter 25, Section 2) is amended to read:
9	"22-13-6.1. GIFTED CHILDRENDETERMINATION
10	A. The department shall adopt standards pertaining
11	to the determination of who is a gifted child and shall
12	publish those standards as part of the educational standards
13	for New Mexico schools.
14	B. In adopting standards to determine who is a
15	gifted child, the department shall provide for the evaluation
16	of selected school-age children by multidisciplinary teams
17	from each child's school district. That team shall be vested
18	with the authority to designate a child as gifted. The team
19	shall consider information regarding a child's cultural and
20	linguistic background and socioeconomic background in the
21	identification, referral and evaluation process. The team
22	also shall consider any disabling condition in the
23	identification, referral and evaluation process.
24	C. Each school district offering a gifted
25	education program shall create one or more advisory

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committees of parents, community members, students and school 1 2 staff members. The school district may create as many 3 advisory committees as there are high schools in the district 4 or may create a single districtwide advisory committee. The 5 membership of each advisory committee shall reflect the 6 cultural diversity of the enrollment of the school district 7 or the schools the committee advises. The advisory committee 8 shall regularly review the goals and priorities of the gifted 9 program, including the operational plans for student 10 identification, evaluation, placement and service delivery 11 and shall demonstrate support for the gifted program. 12 D. In determining whether a child is gifted, the 13 multidisciplinary team shall consider diagnostic or other 14 evidence of the child's: 15 (1) creativity or divergent-thinking 16 ability; 17 critical-thinking or problem-solving (2) 18 ability; 19 (3) intelligence; and 20 (4) achievement."_____ SB 185 Page 2 21 22 23 24 25
