8	Section 1. COMMISSION CREATEDMEMBERSDUTIES	
9	A. There is created the "governor's HIV and AIDS	
10	policy commission", consisting of twenty-three members as	
11	follows:	
12	(1) the secretary of health or the	
13	secretary's designee;	
14	(2) the secretary of human services or the	
15	secretary's designee;	
16	(3) the secretary of public education or the	
17	secretary's designee;	
18	(4) the chief medical officer of the	
19	corrections department or the officer's designee;	
20	(5) the chair of the department of health's	
21	medical advisory committee;	
22	(6) the executive director of the New Mexico	
23	medical insurance pool or the director's designee;	
24	(7) a representative from each of the six

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(8) six consumers reflecting the diversity of the HIV and AIDS populations in New Mexico, including Native Americans and other people of color, appointed by the governor; and

- (9) five public members who have expertise in HIV and AIDS services, prevention, program administration, financial management and other categories of expertise required under federal planning requirements, appointed by the governor.
- B. The governor shall appoint the chair of the commission. Members appointed by the governor shall serve for terms of three years, except that the initial term of seven members shall be two years. Vacancies of the appointed members shall be filled by appointment by the governor for the remainder of the unexpired term. Appointed members shall receive per diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act but shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance. The commission shall be administratively attached to the department, which shall provide administrative services to the commission.
 - C. The commission shall:
- (1) review and make recommendations on department HIV and AIDS policies;
 - (2) study and make recommendations to the

1	department on all factors affecting the availability, quality	
2	and accessibility of health services for persons with HIV and	
3	AIDS, including:	
4	(a) review and consult with the	
5	department's medical advisory committee regarding the HIV and	
6	AIDS drug formulary and policies of selection, utilization

12	(3) serve as a planning and advisory group

15	recommendations to the department for inclusion in the

17	administrative and legislative changes, for resource	
18	allocation by the department and for funding;	
19	(5) provide information on HIV and AIDS	
20	programs and issues as requested by the executive and	
21	legislative branches of government;	
22	(6) advocate for improved and expanded

24	(7) establish task forces as it deems
