6	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
7	"New Mexico Telehealth Commission Act".
8	Section 2. PURPOSEThe purpose of creating a
9	telehealth commission is to encourage a single, coordinated
10	statewide effort to create a telehealth system that:
11	A. provides and supports health care delivery,
12	diagnosis, consultation, treatment, transfer of medical data
13	and education when distance separates a patient and a health
14	care provider; multiple health care providers involved in
15	patient care; and health care providers and educational or
16	professional activities;
17	B. addresses the problems of provider distribution
18	in medically underserved areas of the state;
19	C. strengthens the health infrastructure;
20	D. attracts and retains health care providers in
21	rural areas; and
22	E. helps reduce costs associated with health care
23	and make health care more affordable.
24	Section 3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the New Mexico
25	Telehealth Commission Act:

B. "telehealth" means the use of electronic information, imaging and communication technologies, including interactive audio, video, data communications as well as store-and-forward technologies, to provide and support health care delivery, diagnosis, consultation, treatment, transfer of medical data and education when distance separates the patient and the health care provider.

Section 4. TELEHEALTH COMMISSION CREATED--POWERS AND

The "New Mexico telehealth commission" is The commission is administratively attached to the department of health, which shall work in conjunction with the New Mexico health policy commission, in accordance with the Executive Reorganization Act.

- The commission shall consist of no more than twenty-five members with members, one-third of whom shall be from rural areas, chosen from the following categories, all of whom shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of
  - health care facilities;
  - health care practitioners;
  - health care workforce educators;
  - (4) telehealth technology experts;

1	(5) the telecommunications industry;	
2	(6) the business community;	
3	(7) health care insurance providers or other	
4	health care payers;	
5	(8) Indian nations, tribes and pueblos;	
6	(9) legislators;	
7	(10) state agencies responsible for:	
8	(a) telecommunications;	
9	(b) public health;	
10	(c) medicaid and social services;	
11	(d) workforce development;	
12	(e) children's health and social	
13	services;	
14	(f) services for the elderly and	
15	disabled;	
16	(g) criminal justice;	
17	(h) health policy and planning; and	
18	(i) education; and	
19	(11) other members as the governor may	
20	appoint to ensure appropriate cultural and geographic	
21	representation and the interests of the public.	
22	C. The commission shall:	
23	(1) identify how telehealth can be used to	
24	increase access to care and implement state comprehensive	
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and protection of privacy and confidentiality;

3	cooperation across the state is encouraged;
4	(9) meet at least once each quarter at the
5	call of the chair or vice chair, who shall be designated by

7	(10) report annually to the governor and the
8	legislature on the state of the telehealth system and the
9	adequacy and allocation of telehealth services throughout the
10	state, providing the governor and the legislature with
11	specific recommendations for improving telehealth and related
12	service systems.

14	constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business
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
