A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
board of county commissioners of any county except a class A
county may contract for the use of county equipment or

mutual domestic water associations or other public entities providing services to significant groups of county residents, which services could legally be provided by a governmental entity. In granting this permission, the board shall specifically describe the equipment or property to be used and the entity on whose behalf it will be used.

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7 B. A board of county commissioners may contract 8 for the use of county buildings for the benefit of nonprofit 9 organizations demonstrating a consistent history of service to 10 sick and indigent persons in the county, which service could 11 legally be expected to be provided by a governmental entity, 12 at rates these organizations can be reasonably expected to pay 13 while maintaining their full service commitment to their 14 respective constituencies. Such contracts must set forth the 15 respective value of services being provided to county 16 residents and the relative value of the use of property 17 provided by the county."\_\_\_\_\_ SB 740 Page 2 18
