10	Hispanic influence in the Espanola valley, commencing in 1598	
11	with the first Spanish settlement in Nuevo Mexico and the	
12	opening of the trade route known as El Camino Real, running	
13	from Mexico to the Pueblo of San Juan; and	
14	WHEREAS, the legislature honors and promotes cultural	
15	diversity, including the strong Hispanic culture and	
16	traditions that can be found throughout New Mexico; and	
17	WHEREAS, the city of Espanola and the counties of Rio	
18	Arriba and Santa Fe exemplify cultural diversity and deep-	
19	rooted Hispanic traditions;	
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE	
21	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that February 18, 2005 be recognized as	
22	"Espanola Valley Day" at the New Mexico legislature, honoring	
23	the entire Espanola valley for its diversity of culture and	
24	long-standing Hispanic traditions; and
