SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 800 – Making an Appropriation for the Support of a Baseball team at Luna Vocational-Technical Institute – appropriates \$75,000 from the general fund to the Commission on Higher Education for expenditure in FY06 for the purpose of supporting a baseball team at Luna Vocational-Technical Institute. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY06 shall revert to the general fund.

Significant Issues

Located in Las Vegas, New Mexico, the Luna Vocational-Technical Institute serves the needs of its student population and the surrounding communities. Its mission is to provide comprehensive education, preparation for relevant employment, and opportunities for life-long learning. Its

guiding principles are to:

- Prepare students for employment in entry-level positions through a broad range of vocational, technical, and professional education programs.
- Enhance job effectiveness and continue training in keeping up with changes in the job market and technology.
- Assist students in gaining equitable accessibility to education opportunities.
- Provide continuing education and community service to northeastern New Mexico.
- Promote transfer of credits between institutions of higher education.
- Educate students regarding intellectual, psychological, philosophical, and social issues that address human experience, namely: critical thinking/problem solving, cultural diversity, intra/interpersonal skills, and ethical responsibilities.

This project is not included in CHE's 2005-2006 Higher Education Funding Recommendation.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$75,000 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY06 shall revert to the general fund.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The Commission on Higher Education will retain oversight of this appropriation.
