SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 961 appropriates \$100 thousand dollars from the general fund to the Interstate Stream Commission for the purpose of conducting a study of the salt basin water resource to determine how best to retain the water in New Mexico for use by New Mexico communities.

Significant Issues

The Salt Basin contains a substantial amount of ground water, and contains some perennial surface water flows. Ground water is currently used for irrigation in this area.
