SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 982 authorizes a targeted expansion of the lottery tuition scholarship program. Specifically, the bill expands the window of eligibility between high school graduation (and GED attainment) and enrollment in a public, post-secondary educational institution to full-time resident students who are officers of the New Mexico Future Farmers of America (FFA) organization. The window of eligibility would be 460 days, compared to the 120 day window of eligibility for other eligible students, for a difference of 340 days.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill does not contain an appropriation; however, the fiscal cost to the lottery scholarship fund is estimated as minimal. The state association of the New Mexico Future Farmers of America has a maximum of 8 officers elected to statewide office in a given year that might be eligible for the window as defined in this bill. In effect, lottery expenditures would decline when these individuals did not continue directly from high school to college, but would be additional to the base when they continue on to college.
