SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 1019 reduces the time to notify the sellers in case of used vehicle malfunctions or problems during warranty period.

The bill adds in addition to all other remedies available, if a seller does not honor a warranty, the purchaser may recover from the seller additional statutory damages of \$1 thousand.

Significant Issues

The bill shortens the time, from 30 days to 15 for a consumer to notify the seller of a used car that the vehicle has problems covered by the warranty.

There is an additional \$1 thousand possible exposure for sellers.
