United States Senator Jeff Bingaman (D-NM), with the support of the Navajo Nation, sponsored the authorizing bill to fund the Long Walk Trail feasibility study. After the study is completed, the next step would be to establish the Long Walk Trail as a national historic trail.

The original intent was to establish, "The Navajo Long Walk Trail." After discussions and being educated by representatives of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, however, the proposed trail was renamed to, "The Long Walk Trail," to commemorate and be inclusive of both Tribes affected.
