Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 68 requests that the Legislative Council create an interim Veterans' Affairs Oversight Committee to work with the Veterans' Services Department, the Department of Military Affairs and related agencies to review the functions of state agencies and tribal entities to determine if the needs of veterans are being adequately met by federal, state and tribal governments, how these services may be better coordinated and make recommendations for legislative initiatives to address these and other findings of the committee by November 30, 2005, to assist the Veterans' Department in formulating legislative proposals necessary to implement its recommendations. Copies of this memorial are to be transmitted to the Secretary of Veterans Services, the Adjutant General of Military Affairs and the Co-Chairs of the Legislative Council.

Significant Issues

Information provided in the memorial notes that:

- Approximately two hundred thousand veterans of the U.S. armed forces and the New Mexico National Guard who reside in the state;
- Veterans affairs is a key policy issue for the Legislature, and
- The Legislature recognizes a responsibility to coordinate legislative initiatives related to veterans.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS
