SUMMARY

Synopsis of HJC Amendment

The House Judiciary Committee amendment to Senate Bill 45 expands the criteria on the use of an independent medical examination when a dispute exists between the parties to include:

- the reasonableness or necessity of medical or surgical treatment,
- the date upon which maximum medical improvement was reached,
- the correct impairment rating for the worker,
- the cause of an injury or any other medical issue.

WCA supports this amendment.

Synopsis of Original Bill

Senate Bill 45 reverses an appellate court decision which held that a workers' compensation judge was not authorized to order an independent medical examination of a worker on his or her own motion. This bill allows a Workers' Compensation Judge to order an independent medical examination on his or her own motion any time it will assist with the determination of any issue in the case.

Significant Issues

This bill has been approved by the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Workers' Compensation Administration states that the bill will reduce the average pending time of a workers' compensation case prior to a formal hearing. WCA notes that the information received from an independent medical exam will result in much improved judgments.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None anticipated. The employer is already obligated to pay for independent medical examinations

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Any additional load can be absorbed without additional resources.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

The bill overturns the decision in Ramierez v. IBP Foods, 130 NM 559 (Ct App, 2001)

TECHNICAL ISSUES

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

According to WCA without this legislation, there will be continued degradation of judicial decision-making where the parties fail to request an independent medical examination. Enactment of this legislation will provide faster and higher quality decisions in workers' compensation cases where an additional medical opinion would be helpful.
