### **SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 316 appropriates \$1,300.0 to Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) for the RE: Learning program for school improvement in all grades of public schools statewide.

#### Significant Issues

PED indicates that RE: Learning currently provides services in over 180 schools in 40 school districts. The services include support to change, professional development to support implementation of New Mexico Content Standards and three-tiered teacher licensure.

#### PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

According to PED the program relates to the percent of core academic subjects being taught by highly qualified teachers under the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Relates to public schools performance measures of the percent of 4<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who achieve proficiency or above criterion-referenced assessments in reading, language, arts and math.

# FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 316 appropriates \$1,300.0 from the general fund and is recurring.

The Legislative Education Study Committee includes funding for the RE: Learning program in FY06 budget recommendation within the professional development fund. The Legislative Finance Committee made no recommendations for non-recurring funding for items that were considered recurring. The executive does not make any recommendations for FY06.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

No significant administrative impact to PED.

Relates to House Bill 429, which establishes a Professional Development Fund.
