#### **SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 458 appropriates \$1 million from the general fund to fund to the Children, Youth, and Families Department (CYFD) for the AIM HIGH program to raise the quality of early childhood programs.

#### Significant Issues

It is the intent of the AIM HIGH program to help early childhood programs improve the quality of services provided primarily to children and families receiving the child care subsidy. Currently, there are approximately 50 early childhood programs that are on the waiting list to participate in the AIM HIGH program. This appropriation would allow more early childhood programs to participate in the AIM HIGH program.

Several studies (e.g., Perry Preschool Project, Abecedarian Study, Head Start, Chicago Child-Parent Centers, the Chicago Study and Rand Report 2000) show academic benefits for four-year-olds attending high-quality pre-Kindergarten programs.

The Aim High program establishes five levels of quality child care and encourages child care providers to move through the level system.

The Pre-Kindergarten initiative is part of the Governor's Legislative Package (HB 337 and SB 360). Improving the quality of community child care programs supports and encourages participation in the voluntary pre-Kindergarten initiative.

# PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

CYFD has established performance measures relating to the AIM High quality child care program. Additional funding will increase participation and improve performance outcomes.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$1 million contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY06 shall revert to the general fund.

#### OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

Early childhood programs focus on children from birth to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade (Source: CYFD).

Aim High utilizes a five-point scale to indicate level of quality of child care services in licensed centers, licensed and registered homes, licensed and non-licensed school-age facilities (Source: www.newmexicokids.org website).

Criteria considered by Aim High for quality ratings include specifications in areas like curriculum, amount of training of staff, child-to-teacher ratios according to child age, accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, teacher professional development and evaluation plans (Source: www.newmexicokids.org website).

Beginning in 2005, Aim High rating levels will be displayed by providers of child-care programs (CYFD, Annual Report).
