SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 616 appropriates \$250.0 to PED for the Golden Apple Program.

Significant Issues

According to PED, the program provides supplementary mentoring to Level I teachers to assist them in using the three-tiered licensing system as a tool for increasing teaching effectiveness and career progress. The program provides support to teachers just entering the profession through their participation in a comprehensive summer program, which includes collaborative teaching, supervision by mentors, reflective seminars and instruction on the three-tiered licensing system.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 616 relates to the percent of core academic subjects being taught by highly qualified teachers under federal No Child Left Behind requirements.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 616 appropriates \$250.0 from the general fund and is recurring.

The Legislative Education Study Committee and the executive have recommended funding for this program in their FY06 budget.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

PED will monitor the procurement requirements and evaluation component.
