SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 667 appropriates \$20.0 to the PED to contract with a non-profit organization to improve science education in Santa Fe.

Significant Issues

According to PED, the National Science Teachers Association (NSTA) suggests that elementary students learn science best when involved in first-hand exploration and inquiry/process skills are nurtured.

In addition, the NSTA recommends that elementary science classes include activity based handson experiences for all children.

A National Assessment of Educational Progress teacher survey data show that only about half of middle school eighth grade students across the nation design experiments or investigations, with only about 15% doing so on a monthly basis.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 667 supports the implementation of the content standards and benchmarks in science.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 667 appropriates \$20.0 from the general fund and is recurring.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

PED would be required to apply accepted procurement procedures and monitor the program performance.

Senate Bill 667 duplicates House Bill 611.
