SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Joint Memorial 77 makes findings related to the inability of Dona Ana residents to receive television broadcast signals from Albuquerque and requests the New Mexico congressional delegation to initiate and proceed with legislation to create a single-state designated marketing area and provide for convenient access of the Albuquerque television broadcast signals for Dona Ana county residents.

Significant Issues

According to the AGO, the Cable Television Consumer Protection Act of 1992 imposes "must-carry" provisions on cable television operators, which require cable operators to carry local commercial television stations that are broadcasting within the operator's television market as determined by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The FCC uses market research to determine designated market areas. Television stations may file complaints with the FCC ask-

ing that the agency impose mandatory carriage rights on cable operators.

The AGO further writes that it is uncertain whether the special federal legislation called for by this memorial is the appropriate means of bring Albuquerque television broadcasts to Dona Ana county. Albuquerque stations may file complaints with the FCC in order to impose mandatory carriage rights if they believe their designated market area should include Dona Ana county.
