#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 593 appropriates \$50.0 from the general fund to the Office of the Attorney General for the purpose of funding operation of a Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo division.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$50.0 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2006 shall revert to the general fund.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

Staff from a Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo division in the Attorney General's office would likely be able to provide assistance and advice to the Land Grant Interim Committee, land grant communities throughout the state, and to the executive branch of government.
