9 WHEREAS, the Arizona Water Settlements Act provides New
10 Mexico with one hundred forty thousand acre-feet of Gila basin
11 water in any ten years; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Water Settlements Act provides New Mexico with up to one hundred twenty-eight million dollars (\$128,000,000) to be expended in the southwest planning region to meet water supply demand; and

WHEREAS, regional and local water planning have identified shortfalls of water for the southwest region of New Mexico; and WHEREAS, the Arizona Water Settlements Act is a complex

settlement; and

WHEREAS, a planning process to realize the full benefits of the Arizona Water Settlements Act must include participation by all stakeholders in southwest New Mexico;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the interstate stream commission be requested to employ a multi-stakeholder planning process to . 153619.1
