11	REQUESTING THAT THE SAN JUAN-CHAMA PROJECT WATER CONTRACT
12	BETWEEN THE CITY OF ESPANOLA, THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SANTA FE

17	WHEREAS, on June 13, 1962 (76 Stat. 96), congress approved
18	the initial stage of the San Juan-Chama project, with Colorado
19	and New Mexico as participants in the Colorado river storage
20	project; and
21	WHEREAS, the San Juan-Chama project provides water to a
22	multicounty region, including Taos, Rio Arriba, Santa Fe,
23	Sandoval, Bernalillo and Valencia counties, as well as to
24	tribal governments, municipalities and other entities; and
25	WHEREAS, the San Juan-Chama project is approved for

<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete furnishing water throughout the multicounty region for municipal, domestic and industrial uses and other beneficial purposes; and

WHEREAS, the city of Espanola, located in Rio Arriba and Santa Fe counties, and the United States department of the interior entered into an agreement, dated February 16, 1978, whereby the city was allocated one thousand acre-feet of water per year from the San Juan-Chama project; and

WHEREAS, the city and county of Santa Fe and the United States department of the interior entered into an agreement, dated November 23, 1976, whereby the city and county were allocated five thousand six hundred five acre-feet of water from the San Juan-Chama project; and

WHEREAS, the city of Espanola and the city and county of Santa Fe have utilized the project water to offset excess water usage from their municipal wells and intend to construct a water filtration facility utilizing project water; and

WHEREAS, existing and future users of water within the city of Espanola and the city and county of Santa Fe are dependent upon a reliable, sustainable supply of project water now and over the long term; and

WHEREAS, the agreement between the city of Espanola and the United States department of the interior is due to expire on December 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the agreement between the city and county of . 155525.1

Santa Fe and the United States department of the interior is due to expire on December 31, 2016; and

WHEREAS, other San Juan-Chama contractors, including the city of Albuquerque, the middle Rio Grande conservancy district, the Pojoaque valley irrigation district, the town of Bernalillo, the city of Belen and the town of Red River, all have repayment perpetual agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Jicarilla Apache Nation and the Cochiti reservoir recreational pool have agreements that can only be terminated by an act of congress;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it support, consistent with other regional agreements, the city of Espanola, the city and county of Santa Fe and all other entities that have or may have water service agreements with the United States department of the interior for San Juan-Chama project water contract allotments to have those water service agreements converted to repayment perpetual agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be delivered to the secretary of the United States department of the interior and to members of the New Mexico congressional delegation.
