NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that landowner representatives, the New Mexico cattle grower's association, the New Mexico farm and livestock bureau, the New Mexico association of conservation districts, the New Mexico home builders association, the realtors association of New Mexico, the New Mexico oil and gas association, the independent petroleum association of New Mexico and other interested groups meet in 2005 and diligently work toward developing legislation that can be supported by surface owners and subsurface producers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the groups report their progress to the appropriate interim committee of the legislature prior to the second session of the forty-seventh legislature; and
