

SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
SENATE BILL 301

47TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2006

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CAPITAL PROJECTS GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO MAKE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR SENIOR CITIZEN FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS, FOR HIGHER EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS AND FOR PUBLIC LIBRARY ACQUISITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A TAX LEVY FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL OF, INTEREST ON AND CERTAIN COSTS RELATED TO THE BONDS; REQUIRING APPROVAL OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS AT THE 2006 GENERAL ELECTION OF THE STATE; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act".

Section 2. PURPOSE.--For the purpose of providing funds for capital expenditures as authorized in the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, general obligation

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1 indebtedness of the state is authorized for the purposes and in
2 the amounts set forth in Section 10 of that act.

3 Section 3. BOND TERMS.--

4 A. The state board of finance, except as limited by
5 the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act, shall
6 determine the terms, covenants and conditions of bonds issued
7 pursuant to that act, including but not limited to:

8 (1) date or dates of issue, denominations and
9 maturities;

10 (2) principal amounts;

11 (3) rate or rates of interest; and

12 (4) provisions for redemption, including
13 premiums, registration and refundability, whether the bonds are
14 issued in one or more series and other covenants relating to
15 the bonds and the issuance thereof.

16 B. The bonds shall be in such form as the state
17 board of finance determines with an appropriate series
18 designation and shall bear interest payable as set forth in the
19 resolution of the state board of finance.

20 C. Payment of the principal of the bonds shall
21 begin not more than two years after the date of their issuance,
22 and the bonds shall mature not later than ten years after the
23 date of their issuance. Both principal and interest shall be
24 payable in lawful money of the United States at the office of
25 the paying agent within or without the state as the state board

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1 of finance may direct.

2 D. The bonds shall be executed with the manual or
3 facsimile signature of the governor or the state treasurer, and
4 the seal or a facsimile of the seal of the state shall be
5 placed on each bond, except for any series of bonds issued in
6 book entry or similar form without the delivery of physical
7 securities.

8 E. The bonds shall be issued in accordance with the
9 provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond
10 Act, the Supplemental Public Securities Act and the Uniform
11 Facsimile Signature of Public Officials Act and may be issued
12 in accordance with the Public Securities Short-Term Interest
13 Rate Act.

14 F. The full faith and credit of the state is
15 pledged for the prompt payment when due of the principal of and
16 interest on all bonds issued and sold pursuant to the 2006
17 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act.

18 Section 4. EXPENDITURES.--The proceeds from the sale of
19 the bonds shall be expended solely for providing money to be
20 distributed for the purposes and in amounts not to exceed the
21 amounts set forth in Section 10 of the 2006 Capital Projects
22 General Obligation Bond Act and to pay expenses incurred under
23 Section 6 of that act. Any proceeds from the sale of the bonds
24 that are not required for the purposes set forth in Sections 6
25 and 10 of that act shall be used for the purpose of paying the

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1 principal of and interest on the bonds.

2 Section 5. SALE.--The bonds authorized under the 2006
3 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be sold by
4 the state board of finance at such time and in such manner and
5 amounts as the board may elect. The bonds may be sold at
6 private sale or at public sale, in either case at not less than
7 par plus accrued interest to the date of delivery. If sold at
8 public sale, the state board of finance shall publish a notice
9 of the time and place of sale in a newspaper of general
10 circulation in the state and may also publish the notice in a
11 recognized financial journal outside the state. The required
12 publications shall be made once each week for two consecutive
13 weeks prior to the date fixed for the sale, the last
14 publication thereof to be at least five days prior to the date
15 of the sale. The notice shall specify the amount,
16 denomination, maturity and description of the bonds to be
17 offered for sale and the place, date and hour at which the
18 sealed bids shall be received. At the time and place specified
19 in the notice, the state board of finance shall open the bids
20 in public and shall award the bonds to the bidder or bidders
21 offering the best price for the bonds. The state board of
22 finance may reject any or all bids and readvertise and may
23 waive any irregularity in a bid. All bids, except that of the
24 state, shall be accompanied by a deposit of two percent of the
25 principal amount of the bonds in a form acceptable to the state

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1 board of finance. The deposit of an unsuccessful bidder shall
2 be returned upon rejection of the bid. The state board of
3 finance may also sell the bonds or any part of the bonds to the
4 state treasurer or state investment officer. The state
5 treasurer or state investment officer is authorized to purchase
6 any of the bonds for investment. The bonds are legal
7 investments for any person or board charged with the investment
8 of any public funds and may be accepted as security for any
9 deposit of public money.

10 Section 6. EXPENSES.--The expenses incurred by the state
11 board of finance in or relating to the preparation and sale of
12 the bonds shall be paid out of the proceeds from the sale of
13 the bonds, and all rebate, penalty, interest and other
14 obligations of the state relating to the bonds and bond
15 proceeds under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended,
16 shall be paid from earnings on bond proceeds or other money of
17 the state, legally available for such payments.

18 Section 7. TAX LEVY.--To provide for the payment of the
19 principal of and interest on the bonds issued and sold pursuant
20 to the provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects General
21 Obligation Bond Act, there shall be and there is hereby imposed
22 and levied during each year in which any of the bonds are
23 outstanding an ad valorem tax on all property in the state
24 subject to property taxation for state purposes sufficient to
25 pay the interest as it becomes due on the bonds, together with

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1 an amount sufficient to provide a sinking fund to pay the
2 principal of the bonds as it becomes due and, if permitted by
3 law, ad valorem taxes may be collected to pay administrative
4 costs incident to the collection of such taxes. The taxes
5 shall be imposed, levied, assessed and collected at the times
6 and in the manner that other property taxes for state purposes
7 are imposed, levied, assessed and collected. It is the duty of
8 all tax officials and authorities to cause these taxes to be
9 imposed, levied, assessed and collected.

10 Section 8. TREASURER--DUTIES.--The state treasurer shall
11 keep separate accounts of all money collected pursuant to the
12 taxes imposed and levied pursuant to the provisions of the 2006
13 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act and shall use this
14 money only for the purposes of paying the principal of and
15 interest on the bonds as they become due and any expenses
16 relating thereto.

17 Section 9. IRREPEALABLE CONTRACT--AUTHORITY FOR
18 ISSUANCE.--An owner of bonds issued pursuant to the provisions
19 of the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act may,
20 either at law or in equity, by suit, action or mandamus,
21 enforce and compel the performance of the duties required by
22 that act of any officer or entity mentioned in that act. The
23 provisions of that act constitute an irrepealable contract with
24 the owners of any of the bonds issued pursuant to that act for
25 the faithful performance of which the full faith and credit of

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1 the state is pledged. Without reference to any other act of
 2 the legislature, the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation
 3 Bond Act is full authority for the issuance and sale of the
 4 bonds authorized in that act, and such bonds shall have all the
 5 qualities of investment securities under the Uniform Commercial
 6 Code, shall not be invalid for any irregularity or defect in
 7 the proceedings for the issuance and sale of the bonds and
 8 shall be incontestable in the hands of bona fide purchasers or
 9 holders thereof for value. All bonds issued under the
 10 provisions of that act, and the interest thereon, are exempt
 11 from taxation by the state and any subdivision or public body
 12 thereof.

13 Section 10. PROJECTS.--The proceeds from the sale of
 14 bonds issued under the provisions of the 2006 Capital Projects
 15 General Obligation Bond Act shall be distributed as follows for
 16 the purposes and in the amounts specified:

17 A. for senior citizen facility improvements and
 18 construction, to the aging and long-term services department:

19 (1) one hundred fifty-eight thousand three
 20 hundred forty dollars (\$158,340) to make improvements,
 21 including purchase and installation of equipment, to the North
 22 Valley senior center in Bernalillo county;

23 (2) one hundred forty thousand dollars
 24 (\$140,000) to make improvements, including purchase and
 25 installation of equipment, to the Barelás senior center in

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1 Bernalillo county;

2 (3) one hundred eighty-four thousand five
3 hundred seventy-four dollars (\$184,574) to make improvements,
4 including purchase and installation of equipment, to the
5 Whispering Pines senior meal site in Bernalillo county;

6 (4) five thousand nine hundred fifty dollars
7 (\$5,950) to make improvements, including purchase and
8 installation of equipment, to the Rio Bravo senior meal site in
9 Bernalillo county;

10 (5) fifteen thousand three hundred seventy-six
11 dollars (\$15,376) to make improvements, including purchase and
12 installation of equipment, to the Raymond G. Sanchez senior
13 meal site in Bernalillo county;

14 (6) twenty-two thousand five hundred forty-two
15 dollars (\$22,542) to make improvements, including purchase and
16 installation of equipment, to the Armijo senior meal site in
17 Bernalillo county;

18 (7) seventeen thousand six hundred thirty-two
19 dollars (\$17,632) to make improvements, including purchase and
20 installation of equipment, to the Paradise Hills senior meal
21 site in Bernalillo county;

22 (8) forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to make
23 improvements, including purchase and installation of equipment,
24 to the Highland senior center in Bernalillo county;

25 (9) two hundred thirty-nine thousand dollars

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1 (\$239,000) to make improvements, including purchase and
2 installation of equipment, to the Armijo senior center in
3 Bernalillo county;

4 (10) five thousand nine hundred fifty dollars
5 (\$5,950) to make improvements, including purchase and
6 installation of equipment, to the Pajarito senior meal site in
7 Bernalillo county;

8 (11) forty-two thousand dollars (\$42,000) to
9 make improvements, including purchase and installation of
10 equipment, to the Pueblo of Isleta senior center in Bernalillo
11 county;

12 (12) eighteen thousand sixty-six dollars
13 (\$18,066) to make improvements, including purchase and
14 installation of equipment, to Los Vecinos senior meal site in

11 (19) thirty-one thousand dollars (\$31,000) to
12 make improvements, including purchase and installation of
13 equipment, to the Roswell Joy center in Chaves county;

14 (20) seven hundred sixty-one thousand dollars

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1 A. Bonds issued pursuant to the 2006 Capital
 2 Projects General Obligation Bond Act shall be submitted to the
 3 registered voters of the state at the general election to be
 4 held in November 2006 and, if they receive a majority of all
 5 the votes cast thereon at such election, shall take effect upon
 6 certification of the state canvassing board announcing the
 7 results of such election. No bonds shall be issued or sold
 8 under that act until the registered voters of this state have
 9 voted upon and approved the bonds and property tax as provided
 10 in this section. Any bonds issued under that act shall be
 11 issued within thirty months from the date of such election.

12 B. The ballots used at the 2006 general election
 13 shall contain substantially the following language:

25 C. Each question set forth in this section includes

1 a specific work or object to be financed by the bonds. If any
 2 such question is not approved by a majority vote of the
 3 electorate at the state's 2006 general election, the issuance
 4 of bonds for the work or object specified by the question shall
 5 be excluded from and shall not be part of the 2006 Capital
 6 Projects General Obligation Bond Act. The failure of a
 7 question to be approved by the electorate at the 2006 general
 8 election shall not affect those questions that are approved at
 9 the election.

10 D. The secretary of state shall include the
 11 submission of the capital projects general obligation bonds to
 12 the people at the 2006 general election, and it shall be
 13 included in the general election proclamation of each of the
 14 county clerks. The secretary of state shall cause the 2006
 15 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act to be published in
 16 full in at least one newspaper in each county of the state if
 17 one be published therein, once each week, for four successive
 18 weeks next preceding the general election as required by the
 19 constitution of New Mexico.

20 Section 12. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
 21 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
 22 authorized in the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond
 23 Act include money for the art in public places fund.

24 Section 13. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES--REVERSION.--

25 A. If an appropriation for a project authorized in

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1 the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is not
2 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
3 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
4 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be made
5 for purposes other than those specified in the appropriation.

6 B. The state agencies and state institutions to
7 which money has been appropriated in the 2006 Capital Projects
8 General Obligation Bond Act shall be responsible for monitoring
9 the projects funded in that act to ensure compliance with the
10 constitution and laws of New Mexico, and shall cause to be
11 reverted any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at
12 the earlier of the third full fiscal year after issuance of the
13 bonds or the termination or completion of the specific project.
14 Reverted funds shall be deposited in the debt service fund
15 established by the state treasurer for the purpose of paying
16 the principal of and interest on the state's general obligation
17 bonds.

18 Section 14. SEVERABILITY.--If any part or application of
19 the 2006 Capital Projects General Obligation Bond Act is held
20 invalid, the remainder or its application to other situations
21 or persons shall not be affected.

22 Section 15. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
23 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
