5	Section 1. Section 21-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971,
6	Chapter 235, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
7	"21-1-4. TUITION AND GENERAL FEE CHARGES
8	DEFINITIONS
9	A. The state educational institutions set forth in
10	Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico and
11	their branches, community colleges as provided in Chapter 21,
12	Article 13 NMSA 1978 and technical and vocational institutes
13	as provided in Chapter 21, Article 16 NMSA 1978 shall charge
14	tuition, which is in addition to general or other earmarked
15	fees, as provided by law.
16	B. "Tuition" means the amount of money charged to
17	students for instructional services, which may be charged per
18	term, per course or per credit. "Tuition" does not include
19	required general or other fees.
20	C. "General fee" means a fixed sum charged to
21	students for items not covered by tuition and required of
22	such a proportion of all students that the student who does
23	not pay the charge is an exception. General fees include
24	fees for matriculation, library services, student activities,
25	student union services, student health services, debt service SB 155 Page 1

and athletics. An institution may charge fees in addition to
 general fees that are course-specific or that pertain to a
 smaller proportion of students.

D. During the regular academic year, "full-time student" means a student who is taking twelve or more credit hours in one semester or quarter. Full-time students during the academic year shall be charged tuition at rates provided by law.

During the summer session, "full-time student" 9 Ε. means a student who is taking at least a minimum number of 10 credit hours, which minimum is in the same proportion to 11 twelve credit hours as the duration and normal credit-hour 12 load of the summer session in the particular institution is 13 to the duration and normal credit-hour load of the 14 15 institution's regular semester or quarter. Full-time students in the summer session shall be charged tuition at 16 resident and nonresident rates in each institution, which 17 rates shall be in the same proportion to the full-time 18 resident and nonresident rates of that institution for the 19 20 regular semester or quarter as the minimum number of credit hours is to twelve hours. 21

F. "Part-time student" means a student who is
taking fewer than the minimum number of credit hours in a
semester, quarter or summer session required for full-time
student status. Part-time students shall be charged tuition

SB 155 Page 2 1 at rates per semester credit hour or quarter credit hour as 2 provided by law.

G. The higher education department shall define resident and nonresident students for the purpose of administering tuition charges in accordance with the constitution and statutes of the state and after consultation with the appropriate officials of the institutions concerned. Each institution shall use the uniform definitions so established in assessing and collecting tuition charges from students."\_\_\_\_\_ SB 155 Page 3
