Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 28 appropriates \$85 thousand from the general fund to the Tourism Department for the purpose of promoting adventure tourism and providing hospitality training in McKinley County, New Mexico.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$85 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY07 shall revert to the general fund.
