SUMMARY

Synopsis of the HJC Amendment

The House Judiciary Committee (HJC) amended HB 80 to add the following provision:

Regardless of value, whoever commits forgery of a will, codicil, trust instrument, deed mortgage, lien or any other instrument affecting title to real property is guilty of a 3rd degree felony.

The HJC amendment strikes Section 18 relating to the penalties for writing bad checks and, apparently, a section relating to the 3rd degree felony relating to the exploitation of property.

Synopsis of Original Bill

House Bill 80 (Equitable Sentencing Schedule), for the Courts, Corrections and Justice Committee, amends sections of NMSA 1978 to provide an equitable schedule of sentencing for certain criminal offenses. The bill redefines and/or defines the amount of financial damages necessary for levels of punishments.

House Bill 80 standardizes the levels of crime for a wide variety of financial crimes to make them consistent; and raises the levels at which misdemeanor financial crimes become felonies to compensate for the effect of inflation.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

Issues related to HJC Amendment

The HJC amendment appears to contain incorrect references to the pages and sections of HB 80. The amendment (#1) calls for the insertion of the real property modification on page 10, between lines 12 and 13. The context of the bill suggests that it should be inserted on page 11, between lines 8 and 9 as E, with no renumbering.

Section 18 appears on pages 35 and 36, not 32 through 34.

The striking of lines 20 to 25 on page 49 may not be correct, considering the other errors.
