#### **SUMMARY**

House Bill 249, "Family Violence Prevention Program" appropriates \$36 thousand from the general fund to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial District Court for the purpose of funding two family violence prevention programs: the "Say No to Abusing Power," (SNAP) program and the "Program for the Empowerment of Girls," (PEG).

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$36.0 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general fund.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

It is not clear for what the requested funds would be used and what the expected outcomes of the program are.

#### PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

This program is already operated at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial District and does not have associated performance measures.

Performance measures for the program expansion have not been proposed.

# **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

Increasing the funding for this program will increase the responsibilities for the oversight for this program.

# WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

Not enacting the bill will result the programs continuing as they are.

- 5. What criteria will be used to determine whether to continue requesting funds for and/or continue managing these programs?
- 6. What, if any, other governmental agencies or community organizations are involved with this program?
- 7. Are the SNAP and PEG programs considered alternatives to juvenile detention or other juvenile consequences?
