#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 525 Appropriates \$50 thousand from the general fund to the public education department for the purpose of contracting with a program to train and employ recent college graduates as teachers in the Gallup-McKinley schools.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$50 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general fund.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The measure is intended to address the teacher shortage in the McKinley County area by providing a teacher training program for recent college graduates with content area expertise but who do not have a teacher preparation program.

The bill provides for contracting with a program, but does not specify what type of teacher training program is involved. The University of New Mexico currently has a program where college graduates enroll for a 14 month course of study leading to licensure; however it is not clear whether the university also serves as an employment agent as well.

Provisions of this bill, when implemented, may lead to the Gallup-McKinley schools developing a new pool of prospective teachers to work on reservation schools.

The bill further requires these teachers serve for at least two years..
