### Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 694 appropriates \$83.0 from general fund to the DCA to carry out a survey of the condition of public art created in public buildings statewide as a part of the Works Progress Administration.

House Bill 694 appropriates \$83.0 from the general fund and is recurring. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general fund.
