#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 261 appropriates \$400,000 from the general fund to the Board of Regents of New Mexico State University for expenditure for the Department of Agriculture pursuant to the Pink Bollworm Control Act (Chapter 76, Article 6B, NMSA 1978).

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$400,000 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general fund.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

Funding for this proposal was not included in the agricultural program request from New Mexico State University. It was funded in fiscal year 2006 at the amount of \$42,800 from Chapter 34, Laws of 2005 (Senate Bill 190). The Legislative Finance Committee funding recommendation included this amount as a component of a block-grant appropriation for special project expansion.

This was not included in the Executive budget.

# **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

According the New Mexico Department of Agriculture, there will be a minimum cost impact of \$20,000 to administer this program.
