Section 7. APPROPRIATIONS .--

A. The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the following agencies for expenditure in fiscal year 2008 for the following purposes:

(1) six hundred sixty-two thousand four hundred seventy-eight dollars (\$662,478) to the second judicial district for salaries and benefits and furniture, supplies and equipment for two additional district judges and support staff;

(2) one hundred eighty-one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$181,700) to the fourth judicial district for salaries and benefits and furniture, supplies and equipment for one additional district judge and support staff;

(3) three hundred thirty-one thousand two hundred thirty-nine dollars (\$331,239) to the sixth judicial district for salaries and benefits and furniture, supplies and equipment for one additional district judge and support staff; and

(4) one hundred twelve thousand six hundred fifty-four dollars (\$112,654) to the administrative office of the courts for salary and benefits and furniture, supplies and equipment for one additional magistrate judge in the San Juan magistrate district.

B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2008 shall revert to the general fund.
