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AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; EXTENDING THE TIME LIMITATION FOR PROSECUTING THE CRIMES OF CONSPIRACY AND TAMPERING WITH EVIDENCE TO COINCIDE WITH THE TIME LIMITATION FOR THE UNDERLYING CRIME; CLARIFYING THE TIME LIMITATION FOR PROSECUTING A FIRST DEGREE FELONY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 30-1-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 303, Section 1-8, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-1-8. TIME LIMITATIONS FOR COMMENCING PROSECUTION.--[No] A person shall not be prosecuted, tried or punished in any court of this state unless the indictment is found or information or complaint is filed [therefor] within the time as provided:

for a second degree felony, within six years .163957.1

-	from the time the crime was committed,
2	B. for a third or fourth degree felony, within five
3	years from the time the crime was committed;
4	C. for a misdemeanor, within two years from the
5	time the crime was committed;
6	D. for a petty misdemeanor, within one year from
7	the time the crime was committed;
8	E. for the crime of conspiracy, within the same
9	time period as the crime conspired to be committed would be
10	prosecuted;
11	F. for the crime of tampering with evidence, within
12	the same time period as the crime for which the tampering with
13	evidence was committed would be prosecuted;
14	[E.] G. for any crime against or violation of
15	Section 51-1-38 NMSA 1978, within three years from the time the
16	crime was committed;
17	$[F_{\bullet}]$ \underline{H}_{\bullet} for a felony pursuant to $[Sections]$ $\underline{Section}$
18	7-1-71.3, 7-1-72 or 7-1-73 NMSA 1978 [or Section 4 of this 2005
19	act], within five years from the time the crime was committed;
20	provided that for a series of crimes involving multiple filing
21	periods within one calendar year, the limitation shall begin to
22	run on December 31 of the year in which the crimes occurred;
23	$[G_{\bullet}]$ <u>I.</u> for any crime not contained in the Criminal
24	Code or where a limitation is not otherwise provided for,
25	within three years from the time the crime was committed; and

[H.] J. for a capital felony or a first degree [violent] felony, no limitation period shall exist and prosecution for these crimes may commence at any time after the occurrence of the crime."

Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2007.

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
