AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS; INCREASING THE NUMBER OF UNITS IN MATHEMATICS NEEDED FOR GRADUATION; RECONCILING MULTIPLE AMENDMENTS TO THE SAME SECTION OF LAW IN LAWS 2005.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-13-1.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 5, as amended by Laws 2005, Chapter 314, Section 1 and by Laws 2005, Chapter 315, Section 10) is amended to read:

"22-13-1.1. GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.--

A. At the end of grades eight through eleven, each student shall prepare an interim next-step plan that sets forth the coursework for the grades remaining until high school graduation. Each year's plan shall explain any differences from previous interim next-step plans, shall be filed with the

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principal of the student's high school and shall be signed by
the student, the student's parent and the student's guidance
counselor or other school official charged with coursework
planning for the student.

B. Each student must complete a final next-step
plan during the senior year and prior to graduation. The plan
shall be filed with the principal of the student's high school

charged with coursework planning for the student.

C. An individualized education program that meets
the requirements of Subsections A and B of this section and
that meets all applicable transition and procedural
requirements of the federal Individuals with Disabilities
Education Act for a student with a disability shall satisfy the

and shall be signed by the student, the student's parent and

the student's guidance counselor or other school official

D. A local school board shall ensure that each high school student has the opportunity to develop a next-step plan and is reasonably informed about:

next-step plan requirements of this section for that student.

- (1) curricular and course options;
- (2) opportunities available that lead to different post-high-school options; and
- (3) alternative opportunities available if the student does not finish a planned curriculum.
 - E. The secretary shall:

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1	(1) establish specific accountability
2	standards for administrators, counselors, teachers and school
3	district staff to ensure that every student has the opportunity
4	to develop a next-step plan;
5	(2) promulgate rules for accredited private
6	schools in order to ensure substantial compliance with the
7	provisions of this section;
8	(3) monitor compliance with the requirements
9	of this section; and

- (4) compile such information as is necessary to evaluate the success of next-step plans and report annually, by December 15, to the legislative education study committee and the governor.
- F. Successful completion of a minimum of twentythree units aligned to the state academic content and
 performance standards shall be required for graduation. These
 units shall be as follows:
- (1) four units in English, with major emphasis on grammar and literature;
- of which is equivalent to the algebra l level or higher;

 beginning in the 2007-2008 school year, four units in

 mathematics, at least two of which are equivalent to the

 algebra l level or higher;

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1	(3) two units in science, one of which shall					
2	have a laboratory component; provided, however, that with					
3	students entering the ninth grade beginning in the 2005-2006					
4	school year, three units in science shall be required, one of					
5	which shall have a laboratory component;					
6	(4) three units in social science, which shall					
7	include United States history and geography, world history and					
8	geography and government and economics;					
9	(5) one unit in physical education;					
10	(6) one unit in communication skills or					
11	business education, with a major emphasis on writing and					
12	speaking and that may include a language other than English;					
13	(7) one-half unit in New Mexico history for					
14	students entering the ninth grade beginning in the 2005-2006					
15	school year; and					
16	(8) elective units that meet department					
17	content and performance standards as follows:					
18	(a) nine elective units [and] for					
19	students other than those in Subparagraphs (b) and (c) of this					
20	paragraph;					
21	(b) seven and one-half elective units					
22	for students entering the ninth grade in the 2005-2006 school					
23	year [that meet department content and performance standards];

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- $\underline{G.}$ Student service learning shall be offered as an elective.
- [6.] $\underline{\text{H.}}$ The department shall establish a procedure for students to be awarded credit through completion of specified career technical education courses for certain graduation requirements.
- $[H_{ullet}]$ I. Final examinations shall be administered to all students in all classes offered for credit.
- [1.] J. A student [shall not receive a high school diploma] who has not passed a state graduation examination in the subject areas of reading, English, mathematics, writing, science and social science shall not receive a high school diploma. The state graduation examination on social science shall include a section on the constitution of the United States and the constitution of New Mexico. If a student exits from the school system at the end of grade twelve without having passed a state graduation examination, the student shall receive an appropriate state certificate indicating the number of credits earned and the grade completed. If within five years after a student exits from the school system the student takes and passes the state graduation examination, the student may receive a high school diploma.
 - $[J_{\bullet}]$ K. As used in this section:
- (1) "final next-step plan" means a next-step .164793.1

plan that shows that the student has committed or intends to commit in the near future to a four-year college or university, a two-year college, a trade or vocational program, an internship or apprenticeship, military service or a job;

- (2) "interim next-step plan" means an annual next-step plan in which the student specifies post-high-school goals and sets forth the coursework that will allow the student to achieve those goals; and
- (3) "next-step plan" means an annual personal written plan of studies developed by a student in a public school or other state-supported school or institution in consultation with the student's parent and school counselor or other school official charged with coursework planning for the student.
- $[K_{ullet}]$ L. The secretary may establish a policy to provide for administrative interpretations to clarify curricular and testing provisions of the Public School Code."

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
