AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC FINANCE; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO ESTABLISH A SEARCHABLE TAXPAYER TRANSPARENCY WEB SITE THAT PROVIDES THE PUBLIC WITH INFORMATION ABOUT STATE REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- STATE REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE REPORTS--Section 1. SEARCHABLE WEB SITE. --
- The department of finance and administration shall establish a searchable taxpayer transparency web site that provides the public with information about state revenues and expenditures.
 - The web site shall include:
- the annual operating budgets of state agencies;

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-	(2) Special appropriations received outside
2	the general appropriation act by each state agency and the
3	purpose of those appropriations;
4	(3) monthly revenue reports that detail:
5	(a) how much money the state received in
6	the preceding month that identifies the source, such as type of
7	tax, fee, fine or other collection category;
8	(b) into which fund, account or
9	subaccount in the state treasury the money was deposited; and
10	(c) revenue disbursements in the
11	preceding month to local governments, government
12	instrumentalities, the general fund and other state funds from
13	revenue collections;
14	(4) monthly expenditure reports that detail
15	expenditures from each fund in the state treasury for the
16	preceding month that identifies the expenditure by:
17	(a) state agency;
18	(b) expenditure line-item in the
19	contractual services budget category;
20	(c) source of funding; and
21	(d) recipient;
22	(5) monthly budget adjustment requests,
23	pending and approved, by state agency and affected line-item
24	and budget category;
25	(6) reversions and cash balances by state
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agency and fund;

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- (7) annual and special audits;
- the monthly department of finance and (8) administration capital outlay monitoring report, including the amounts paid and remaining from severance tax bonds, general obligation bonds, the general fund and other state funds;
- (9) state board of finance loans to other agencies or political subdivisions and the purpose of those loans; and
- (10) any other information the department determines would benefit the public's understanding of state revenues and expenditures.
- C. As used in this section, "state agency" means a department, office, board, commission, institution of higher learning or other agency or institution of the executive branch.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal years 2007 and 2008 to establish a searchable web site that provides the public with information about state revenues and expenditures. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2008 shall revert to the general fund.
