(2) within twenty-four hours after the officer first arrives at the scene of a domestic disturbance and the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed an assault or a battery upon a household member, even if the person is no longer present at the scene.

B. As used in this section, "household member" 8 means a spouse; former spouse; family member, including a relative, parent, present or former step-parent, present or former in-law, child or co-parent of a child; or a person with whom the victim has had a continuing personal relationship. 12 Cohabitation is not necessary to be deemed a household member for purposes of this section.

[B.] C. No peace officer shall be held criminally or civilly liable for making an arrest pursuant to this section, provided [he] the officer acts in good faith and without malice.

[C.] D. Whether or not an arrest is made pursuant to this section, a peace officer may remain with the victim and assist the victim in getting to a shelter or receiving proper medical attention."

Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2007.
