15	Section 1. Section 7-9-93 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004,
16	Chapter 116, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"7-9-93. DEDUCTIONGROSS RECEIPTS[CERTAIN] RECEIPTS
18	FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER
19	A. Receipts from payments [by a managed health care
20	provider or health care insurer for commercial contract
21	services or medicare part C] for services provided by a health
22	care practitioner that are not otherwise deductible pursuant to

24	Act may be deducted from gross receipts, provided that the

"commercial contract services" means health care services 6 7 performed by a health care practitioner pursuant to a contract with a managed health care provider or health care insurer 8 9 other than those health care services provided for medicare 10 patients pursuant to Title 18 of the federal Social Security 11 Act or for medicaid patients pursuant to Title 19 or Title 21 12 of the federal Social Security Act; (2) "health care insurer" 13 means a person that: (a) has a valid certificate of authority 14 in good standing pursuant to the New Mexico Insurance Code to 15 act as an insurer, health maintenance organization or nonprofit 16 health care plan or prepaid dental plan; and (b) contracts to 17 reimburse licensed health care practitioners for providing 18 basic health services to enrollees at negotiated fee rates; 19 (3)] "health care practitioner" means:

[(a)] (1) a chiropractic physician licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Chiropractic Physician Practice Act;

[(b)] (2) a dentist or dental hygienist licensed pursuant to the Dental Health Care Act;
