14	LAWS 2003, CHAPTER 379, SECTION 1.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. Section 21-1-27.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2002,
18	Chapter 31, Section 1, as amended by Laws 2003, Chapter 379,
19	Section 1 and by Laws 2003, Chapter 392, Section 1) is amended
20	to read:
21	"21-1-27.1. FACULTY ENDOWMENT FUND CREATED
22	A. The "faculty endowment fund" is created in the
23	state treasury. The fund shall consist of appropriations,
24	income from investment of the fund, gifts, grants, donations
25	and bequests. [Money in the fund shall not revert at the end
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1 of any fiscal year.]

2	B. The faculty endowment fund shall be administered
3	by the [commission on] higher education [Except as provided in
4	Subsection J of this section] department. Money shall be
5	disbursed only on warrant of the secretary of finance and
6	administration upon voucher signed by the [executive director
7	of the commission on] <u>secretary of</u> higher education or [his]
8	the secretary's authorized representative.
9	C. Money shall be disbursed from the faculty
10	endowment fund only to establish endowments [for chairs,
11	professorships and faculty development programs at four-year]
12	at public post-secondary educational institutions as provided
13	in this section. [Except as provided in Subsection J of this
14	section] An institution shall not receive a disbursement for an
15	endowment until that institution has notified the [commission
16	on higher education] department that it has received matching
17	funds for the endowment from other than governmental sources in
18	[an amount that is equal to or greater than the amount
19	authorized by this section to be disbursed for the endowment]
20	the amount specified in this section.
21	D. [Except as provided in Subsection J of this

D. [Except as provided in Subsection J of this section] Money in the faculty endowment fund is appropriated to the [commission on higher education] department to be disbursed for [the following endowment purposes in the following amounts: (1) for endowed chairs, five hundred thousand

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dollars (\$500,000) for each endowed chair;

2 (2) for endowed professorships, two hundred 3 thousand dollars (\$200,000) for each endowed professorship; and 4 (3) for endowed faculty development programs, to include lectureships, graduate fellowships and other faculty 5 6 support programs, thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars 7 (\$37,500) for each endowed faculty development program] endowment purposes, including endowed chairs, lectureships, 8 9 professorships, scholarships, graduate assistantships, faculty 10 development programs and other purposes that will enhance the 11 quality of public post-secondary education in New Mexico. The 12 department, by rule, shall establish procedures for disbursing 13 money from the fund. Not less than five percent of each 14 institution's total endowment effort resulting from amounts 15 specified in this section shall address one or more of the 16 governor's initiatives in film, energy, aerospace or education. 17 [Except as provided in Subsection J of this Ε.

section] Until June 30, [2005] 2010, the following institutions shall be eligible for the following disbursements from the fund:

[(1) the university of New Mexico for four endowed chairs;

(2) New Mexico state university for four endowed chairs;

(3) New Mexico institute of mining and

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technology for two endowed chairs;

2 (4) the university of New Mexico for two
3 endowed chairs at the university of New Mexico medical center;
4 and

(5) the university of New Mexico, New Mexico 5 6 state university, New Mexico highlands university, New Mexico 7 institute of mining and technology, western New Mexico university and eastern New Mexico university for endowed 8 9 professorships and endowed faculty development programs. The 10 number of endowed professorships and endowed faculty 11 development programs allocated to each of the named 12 institutions shall be in the same ratio to the total number of 13 endowed professorships and endowed faculty development programs 14 allocated to all of the named institutions as the main campus 15 full-time-equivalent enrollment of the institution bears to the 16 total main campus full-time-equivalent enrollment of all of the 17 named institutions. For purposes of this paragraph, the main 18 campus full-time-equivalent enrollment of each institution 19 shall be based on enrollment figures for the second semester of 20 the 2001-2002 school year.

F. On or after July 1, 2005, money remaining in the faculty endowment fund shall be available for additional disbursements by the commission on higher education to any of the institutions named in this section, subject to receipt of matching funds. Disbursements may be made based on the date .166953.1

3	(1) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) each for
4	the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university and
5	the New Mexico institute of mining and technology and one
6	million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) for the
7	university of New Mexico school of medicine; provided that no
8	disbursement shall be made pursuant to this paragraph until the
9	institution has shown to the satisfaction of the department
10	that it has received matching funds in an amount equal to at
11	least fifty percent of the disbursement;
12	(2) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
13	each for New Mexico highlands university, eastern New Mexico
14	university, western New Mexico university and northern New
15	Mexico state school; provided that no disbursement shall be
16	made pursuant to this paragraph until the institution has shown
17	to the satisfaction of the department that it has received
18	matching funds in an amount equal to at least forty percent of
19	the disbursement; and
20	(3) for the total endowments at the New Mexico
21	military institute, community colleges, branch community
22	colleges and technical and vocational institutes, two million
23	five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000), provided that:
24	(a) the total amount shall be
25	distributed pursuant to rules of distribution promulgated by
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1 the department that ensure each eligible institution an 2 opportunity to receive an equitable share of the total amount 3 to be distributed; and 4 (b) no disbursement shall be made 5 pursuant to this paragraph until the institution has shown to the satisfaction of the department that it has received 6 7 matching funds in an amount equal to at least thirty percent of 8 the disbursement. 9 F. Effective July 1, 2010, funds remaining in the 10 faculty endowment fund may be matched by any public post-11 secondary institution in this section for the purposes stated 12 in this section in accordance with the rules established by the 13 department. 14 G. The endowment funds of the institutions shall 15 not be expended but shall be invested by the institutions in 16 accordance with the prudent [man] investor rule, and in 17 accordance with the provisions of Section 21-1-38 NMSA 1978. 18 The income from the investments shall be used by the 19 institutions to provide funding for chairs, <u>lectureships</u>, 20 professorships, scholarships, graduate assistantships and 21 faculty development programs and other purposes, including 22 paying all or a portion of the salary of the faculty member or 23 the expenses necessary to support associated academic 24 activities.

[H. Except as provided in Subsection J of this .166953.1

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1	section, disbursements of the faculty endowment fund by the
2	commission on higher education shall be allocated as follows:
3	(1) fifty percent of the disbursements shall
4	be for endowed chairs;
5	(2) thirty-five percent of the disbursements
6	shall be for endowed professorships; and
7	(3) fifteen percent of the disbursements shall
8	be for endowed faculty development programs.
9	I. If the disbursements allocated for endowed
10	chairs are not sufficient to fund the number of positions
11	specified in Paragraphs (1) through (4) of Subsection E of this
12	section, the number of endowed chairs for each of those four
13	institutions shall be proportioned by the commission on higher
14	education in the same manner as endowed professorships and
15	endowed faculty development programs are proportioned in
16	Paragraph (5) of Subsection E of this section, except that each
17	of the four institutions shall be allocated at least one
18	endowed chair.
19	J. Up to three million dollars (\$3,000,000) of
20	the faculty endowment fund may be disbursed after July 1,
21	2003 to the commission on higher education to endow and
22	disburse the money for one endowed chair each to the
23	university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university and the
24	New Mexico institute of mining and technology. Each endowed
25	chair shall be eligible for one million dollars (\$1,000,000)
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upon notification by the institution that it has received matching funds for the endowment from other than state sources in an amount equal to or greater than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for establishment of an endowed chair that is directly related to the economic development of the state.]

H. No later than July 1 of 2008, 2009 and 2010, the department shall report to the legislative finance committee on disbursements made pursuant to this section. The report shall include the amounts disbursed to each institution, the amount of matching funds and their source and the purpose of the endowments."

Section 2. APPROPRIATION.--Twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the faculty endowment fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2007 and subsequent fiscal years for the purpose of making disbursements for endowments pursuant to Section 21-1-27.1 NMSA 1978. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2012 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3. REPEAL.--Laws 2003, Chapter 379, Section 1 is repealed.

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
