15	Section 1. Section 41-4-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1976,
16	Chapter 58, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"41-4-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Tort Claims Act:
18	A. "board" means the risk management advisory
19	board;
20	B. "governmental entity" means the state or any
21	local public body as defined in Subsections C and H of this
22	section;
23	C. "local public body" means all political
24	subdivisions of the state and their agencies, instrumentalities
25	and institutions and all water and natural gas associations
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1	organized pursuant to Chapter 3, Article 28 NMSA 1978;
2	D. "law enforcement officer" means a full-time
3	salaried public employee of a governmental entity whose
4	principal duties under law are to hold in custody any person
5	accused of a criminal offense, to maintain public order or to
6	make arrests for crimes, or members of the national guard when
7	called to active duty by the governor;
8	E. "maintenance" does not include:
9	(1) conduct involved in the issuance of a
10	permit, driver's license or other official authorization to use
11	the roads or highways of the state in a particular manner; or
12	(2) an activity or event relating to a public
13	building or public housing project that was not foreseeable;
14	F. "public employee" means an officer, employee or
15	servant of a governmental entity, excluding independent
16	contractors except for individuals defined in Paragraphs (7),
17	(8), (10) and (14) of this subsection, or of a corporation
18	organized pursuant to the Educational Assistance Act, the Small
19	Business Investment Act or the Mortgage Finance Authority Act
20	or a licensed health care provider providing voluntary services
21	as defined in Paragraph (16) of this subsection and including:
22	(1) elected or appointed officials;
23	(2) law enforcement officers;
24	(3) persons acting on behalf or in service of
25	a governmental entity in any official capacity, whether with or
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	1	without compensation;
	2	(4) licensed foster parents providing care for
	3	children in the custody of the human services department,
	4	corrections department or department of health, but not
	5	including foster parents certified by a licensed child

12	Mexico or any of its branches, agencies, departments, boards,
13	instrumentalities or institutions."
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
