18	A. Notwithstanding any other provision of the
19	Procurement Code, a contract with a lawyer or law firm, either
20	in the form of a flat, hourly or contingent fee contract,
21	including expenses, exceeding or reasonably expected to exceed
22	one million dollars (\$1,000,000), shall only be procured by
23	competitive sealed proposals.
24	B. An hourly fee for contracts referred to in this
25	section shall not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000). An

<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete hourly fee for flat or contingency fee contracts shall be determined by dividing the total hours worked into the fee, less expenses, and if that hourly fee exceeds one thousand dollars (\$1,000), it shall be reduced to one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

6 A contract referred to in this section shall not C. 7 be effective until approved by the attorney general. The 8 attorney general may require changes to the contract prior to 9 approval. The state agency or local public body procuring the 10 lawyer or law firm services shall submit a copy of the approved 11 contract to the legislative finance committee for informational 12 purposes."
