| 17 | A. Eighteen million two hundred thousand dollars |
| 18 | (\$18,200,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the |
| 19 | children, youth and families department for expenditure in |
| 20 | fiscal year 2008 as follows: |

high and stars programs designed to increase the quality of early child care programs;

- (3) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for scholarships to help early childhood teachers study child development and early learning while earning college degrees;
- (4) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for a pilot program of wage supplements for early childhood teachers, based on the educational levels that those teachers achieve; and
- (\$4,200,000) to increase quality services through child development grants for working families with children from birth to five years of age.
- B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2008 shall revert to the general fund.

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
