11	RELATING TO ORIENTAL MEDICINE; CLARIFYING THE PRACTICE OF
12	ORIENTAL MEDICINE AND PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY OF DOCTORS OF
13	ORIENTAL MEDICINE.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 61-14A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
17	Chapter 158, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"61-14A-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Acupuncture and
19	Oriental Medicine Practice Act:
20	A. "acupuncture" means the surgical use of needles
21	inserted into and removed from the body and the use of other
22	devices, modalities and procedures at specific locations on the
23	body for the prevention, cure or correction of any disease,
24	illness, injury, pain or other condition by controlling and
25	regulating the flow and balance of energy and function to
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restore and maintain health;

B. "board" means the board of acupuncture and
oriental medicine;

C. "doctor of oriental medicine" means a person licensed as a physician to practice acupuncture and oriental medicine with the ability to practice independently, serve as a primary care provider and as necessary collaborate with other health care providers;

D. "moxibustion" means the use of heat on or above specific locations or on acupuncture needles at specific locations on the body for the prevention, cure or correction of any disease, illness, injury, pain or other condition;

E. "oriental medicine" means the distinct system of primary health care that uses all allied techniques of oriental medicine, both traditional and modern, to diagnose, treat and prescribe for the prevention, cure or correction of [any] disease, illness, injury, pain or other physical or mental condition by controlling and regulating the flow and balance of energy, <u>form</u> and function to restore and maintain health;

F. "primary care provider" means a health care practitioner acting within the scope of [his] the health care <u>practitioner's</u> license who provides the first level of basic or general health care for a person's health needs, including diagnostic and treatment services, initiates referrals to other health care practitioners and maintains the continuity of care .164928.1

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2	G. "techniques of oriental medicine" means:
3	(1) the diagnostic and treatment techniques
4	used in oriental medicine that include diagnostic procedures;
5	acupuncture; moxibustion; manual therapy, also known as tui na;
6	other physical medicine modalities and therapeutic procedures;
7	breathing and exercise techniques; and dietary, nutritional and
8	lifestyle counseling;
9	(2) the [prescription or administration]
10	prescribing, administering, compounding or dispensing of [any]
11	herbal [medicine] medicines, homeopathic [medicine] medicines,
12	vitamins, minerals, <u>amino acids, proteins</u> , enzymes,
13	carbohydrates, lipids, glandular products, natural substances,
14	natural products, natural medicines, traditional medicines,
15	protomorphogens, live cell products, gerovital [amino acids]
16	and dietary and nutritional supplements;
17	(3) the [prescription or administration]
18	prescribing, administering, compounding or dispensing of
19	devices, restricted devices and prescription devices, as those
20	devices are defined in the New Mexico Drug, Device and Cosmetic
21	Act, if the board determines by rule that the devices are

devices are defined in the New Mexico Drug, Device and Cosmet Act, if the board determines by rule that the devices are necessary in the practice of oriental medicine and if the prescribing doctor of oriental medicine has fulfilled requirements for prescriptive authority in accordance with rules promulgated by the board for the devices enumerated in .164928.1

2 (4) the [prescription or administration] 3 prescribing, administering, compounding or dispensing of 4 cosmetics, biological products, including therapeutic serum, 5 and [over-the-counter] nonprescription drugs, other than those 6 enumerated in Paragraph (2) of this subsection, as those are 7 defined in the New Mexico Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act and the 8 Pharmacy Act, if the prescribing doctor of oriental medicine 9 has fulfilled the requirements for expanded prescriptive 10 authority in accordance with rules promulgated by the board for 11 the substances enumerated in this paragraph; and 12 the [prescription or administration] (5) 13 prescribing, administering, compounding or dispensing of the 14 following dangerous drugs or controlled substances as they are 15 defined in the New Mexico Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, [or] 16 the Controlled Substances Act or the Pharmacy Act, if the 17 prescribing doctor of oriental medicine has fulfilled the 18 requirements for [extended or] expanded prescriptive authority 19 in accordance with rules promulgated by the board for the 20 substances enumerated in this paragraph: 21 sterile water; (a) 22 (b) sterile saline; 23 (c) sarapin or its generic;

(d) caffeine;

(e) procaine;

9	H. "tutor" means a doctor of oriental medicine with
10	at least ten years of clinical experience who is a teacher of
11	acupuncture and oriental medicine."
12	Section 2. Section 61-14A-4.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
13	Chapter 193, Section 1) is amended to read:
14	"61-14A-4.1. CERTIFIED AURICULAR DETOXIFICATION
15	SPECIALISTS, SUPERVISORS AND TRAINING PROGRAMSFEES
16	A. A person who is not a doctor of oriental
17	medicine or who is not a person certified as an auricular
18	detoxification specialist pursuant to the Acupuncture and
19	Oriental Medicine Practice Act shall not:
20	(1) practice auricular acupuncture for the
21	treatment of alcoholism, substance abuse or chemical
22	dependency;
23	(2) use the title of or represent as a
24	certified auricular detoxification specialist or use any other
25	title, abbreviation, letters, figures, signs or devices that
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1 indicate that the person is certified to practice as an 2 auricular detoxification specialist; or 3 advertise, hold out to the public or (3) 4 represent in any manner that the person is authorized to practice auricular detoxification. 5 6 Β. The board shall issue an auricular 7 detoxification specialist certification to a person who has 8 paid an application fee to the board and has successfully 9 completed all board requirements. The board shall adopt rules 10 that require an applicant to: 11 (1) successfully complete the national 12 acupuncture detoxification association training or equivalent 13 training approved by the board that shall include clean needle 14 technique training; 15 (2) demonstrate experience in treatment, 16 disease prevention, harm reduction and counseling of people 17 suffering from alcoholism, substance abuse or chemical 18 dependency or become employed by a substance abuse treatment 19 program; 20 complete a board-approved training program (3) 21 that will include examinations on clean needle technique, 22 jurisprudence and other skills required by the board; and 23 (4) demonstrate a record free of convictions 24 for drug- or alcohol-related offenses for at least two 25 consecutive years before the person applied to the board for .164928.1 - 6 -

2 C. A certified auricular detoxification specialist 3 is authorized to perform auricular acupuncture and the 4 application to the ear of simple board-approved devices that do 5 not penetrate the skin for the purpose of treating and 6 preventing alcoholism, substance abuse or chemical dependency. 7 The specialist shall use the five auricular point national 8 acupuncture detoxification procedure or auricular procedures 9 approved or established by rule of the board and shall only 10 treat or prevent alcoholism, substance abuse or chemical 11 dependency within a board-approved program that demonstrates 12 experience in disease prevention, harm reduction or the 13 treatment or prevention of alcoholism, substance abuse or 14 chemical dependency.

D. A person certified pursuant to this section shall use the title "certified auricular detoxification specialist" or "C.A.D.S." for the purpose of advertising auricular acupuncture services to the public.

E. A certified auricular detoxification specialist shall apply with the board to renew the certification. The board shall for one year renew the certification of an applicant who pays a renewal fee and completes the requirements established by rule of the board. An applicant who does not apply for renewal before the last date that the certification is valid may be required to pay a late fee pursuant to a rule .164928.1

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of the board. The board shall deem a certification for which a renewal has not been applied within sixty days of that date as expired and an applicant that seeks valid certification shall apply with the board for new certification. The board shall by rule require an applicant for renewal of the certification to demonstrate a record free of convictions for drug- or alcoholrelated offenses for a minimum of one year prior to application for renewal with the board.

F. A certified auricular detoxification specialist shall practice under the supervision of a licensed doctor of oriental medicine registered with the board as an auricular detoxification specialist supervisor. A supervising doctor of oriental medicine shall be accessible for consultation directly or by telephone to a practicing auricular detoxification specialist. The supervising doctor of oriental medicine shall not supervise more specialists than permitted by board rule. Supervision requirements shall be provided by rule of the board.

19 G. A doctor of oriental medicine who supervises a 20 certified auricular detoxification specialist shall apply for 21 registration with the board. The board shall issue an 22 auricular detoxification specialist supervisor registration to 23 a doctor of oriental medicine who fulfills board requirements. 24 The board shall by rule require an applicant for registration 25 to list the certified auricular detoxification specialists that .164928.1 - 8 -

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will be supervised, pay an application fee for registration and demonstrate clinical experience in treating or counseling people suffering from alcoholism, substance abuse or chemical dependency. [The registration shall be valid until July 31 following the initial registration.

H. A doctor of oriental medicine who is registered to supervise certified auricular detoxification specialists shall apply to renew the registration annually with the board. The board shall renew the registration of an applicant who fulfills board requirements. The board shall by rule require an applicant to list the certified auricular detoxification specialists that the applicant is supervising and pay a fee for registration renewal. The renewed registration shall be valid for one year. An applicant who does not apply for renewal before the last date that the certification is valid may be required to pay a late fee pursuant to a rule of the board. The board shall deem a registration for which a renewal has not been applied within sixty days of that date as expired and an applicant that seeks valid registration shall apply with the board for new registration.

 $\overline{I+1}$ <u>H</u>. A training program that educates auricular detoxification specialists for certification shall apply for approval by the board. The board shall approve a training program that fulfills the board requirements established by rule and that pays an application fee. The approval shall be .164928.1

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valid until July 31 following the initial approval.

2 [J.] I. A training program that is approved by the 3 board to provide training for certification of auricular 4 detoxification specialists shall apply to renew the approval 5 with the board. The board shall renew the approval of a program that fulfills board requirements established by rule, 6 7 and the renewal shall be valid for one year. An applicant who 8 does not renew before the last date that the renewed approval 9 is valid shall pay a late fee. The board shall deem a program 10 approval that is not renewed within sixty days of that date as 11 expired and a program that seeks board approval shall apply 12 with the board for new approval.

[K.] J. The board shall impose the following fees:

(2) a fee not to exceed seventy-five dollars(\$75.00) for renewal of an auricular detoxification specialist certification;

(3) an application fee not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) for registration of a certified auricular detoxification specialist supervisor;

[(4) a fee not to exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for the renewal of the registration of a certified auricular detoxification specialist supervisor;

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1 (5)] (4) an application fee not to exceed two 2 hundred dollars (\$200) for the approval of an auricular 3 detoxification specialist training program; 4 [(6)] (5) a fee not to exceed one hundred 5 fifty dollars (\$150) for the renewal of the approval of an 6 auricular detoxification training specialist training program; 7 and 8 [(7)] <u>(6)</u> a late fee not to exceed fifty 9 dollars (\$50.00) for applications for renewal filed after the 10 last valid date of a registration, certification, approval or 11 renewal issued pursuant to this section. 12 [L.] K. In accordance with the procedures set forth 13 in the Uniform Licensing Act, the board may deny, revoke or 14 suspend any certification, registration, approval or renewal 15 that a person holds or applies for pursuant to this section 16 upon findings by the board that the person violated any rule 17 established by the board." 18 Section 3. Section 61-14A-8.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2000, 19 Chapter 53, Section 12) is amended to read: 20 "61-14A-8.1. [EXTENDED OR] EXPANDED PRESCRIPTIVE 21 AUTHORITY--[CERTIFICATION] CERTIFICATIONS.--[A. The board may 22 issue certification for extended prescriptive authority as 23 defined by the board to a doctor of oriental medicine who has 24 submitted completed forms provided by the board, paid the 25 application fee for certification and submitted proof of .164928.1

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1 successful completion of additional training required by rule
2 of the board.

B.] The board [may] shall issue [certification] 3 4 certification, as determined by rule of the board, for expanded prescriptive authority only for the substances listed in [this] 5 Section 61-14A-3 NMSA 1978 to a doctor of oriental medicine who 6 7 has submitted completed forms provided by the board, paid the 8 application fee for certification and submitted proof of 9 successful completion of additional training required by rule 10 of the board. The board shall issue certifications in the 11 expanded prescriptive authority practices of basic injection 12 therapy, injection therapy, intravenous therapy and 13 bioidentical hormone therapy. The board shall adopt the rules 14 determined by the board of pharmacy for additional training 15 required for [the prescription or administration] prescribing, 16 administering, compounding or dispensing of caffeine, procaine, 17 oxygen, epinephrine and bioidentical hormones. The board and 18 the board of pharmacy shall consult as appropriate."

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
