Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] DESECRATION OF ROADSIDE MEMORIALS--PENALTY. --

- A person shall not knowingly or willfully deface or destroy, in whole or in part, a descanso, also known as a memorial, placed alongside a public road right of way to memorialize a motor vehicle accident that resulted in the death of one or more persons.
- A person who violates the provisions of Subsection A of this section is:
