AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; CREATING A FUND; AUTHORIZING DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE FUND FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Severance Tax Bonding Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] AUTHORIZATION FOR SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in fiscal years 2007 through 2012 in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding a total of two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000) when the department of transportation certifies

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1 the need for the issuance of the bonds; provided that no more
2 than fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000) of severance tax
3 bonding capacity may be used in any one fiscal year. The state
4 board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
5 bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
6 upon a finding by the board that, based upon a certification
7 from the department of transportation, the proceeds of the
8 bonds are needed and that the projects can proceed to contract
9 within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall
10 further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the
11 federal Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The state
12 board of finance may issue and sell the bonds in the same
13 manner as other severance tax bonds in an amount not to exceed
14 the authorized amount provided for in this subsection. Any
15 amount not certified for issuance in a fiscal year may be
16 carried forward and credited against the amount to be certified
17 in subsequent fiscal years.

18 B. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
19 appropriated to the severance tax transportation fund for
20 distribution as directed by the department of transportation
21 for projects pursuant to Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978.

22 C. Money from the severance tax bonds provided for
23 in this section shall not be used to pay indirect costs. If
24 the department of transportation has not certified the need for
25 the issuance of the bonds by April 1, 2012, the authorization

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1 provided in this section shall expire."

2 Section 2. A new section of the New Mexico Finance
3 Authority Act, Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

4 "6-21-6.12. [NEW MATERIAL] SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION
5 FUND--CREATED--DISTRIBUTIONS.--

6 A. The "severance tax transportation fund" is
7 created within the authority. The fund shall be administered
8 by the authority as a separate account, but may consist of
9 subaccounts if the authority deems them necessary to carry out
10 the purpose of the fund. The fund shall consist of severance
11 tax bond proceeds appropriated to the fund and, except as
12 provided in Subsection E of this section, all earnings of the
13 fund.

14 B. Except as provided in Subsection D of this
15 section, upon certification by the department of transportation
16 that a project has been approved for payment and upon
17 compliance with the requirements of this section, money in the
18 fund shall be distributed to local governments for projects
19 specifically authorized by the legislature. The authority
20 shall issue payment to the local government named in the
21 project application and certification.

22 C. Except as provided in Subsection D of this
23 section, distributions from the fund shall be made pursuant to
24 the following criteria:

25 (1) the department of transportation shall

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1 establish funding priorities and qualifications for the
2 transportation projects that are certified for funding from the
3 fund;

4 (2) distributions from the fund shall be used
5 to pay no more than the state's portion of the total cost
6 necessary to develop and construct the project as presented in
7 the approved application;

8 (3) to qualify for funding, a local government
9 shall apply for funding through the department of
10 transportation's regional or metropolitan planning
11 organizations;

12 (4) a local government shall show, to the
13 satisfaction of the department of transportation, that it will
14 match the distribution from the severance tax transportation
15 fund in the following amounts:

16 (a) for a project with a total cost of
17 one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or less, the local government
18 shall contribute ten percent of the total project cost;

19 (b) for a project with a total cost
20 greater than one million dollars (\$1,000,000), but less than or
21 equal to six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local government
22 shall contribute twenty percent of the total project cost; and

23 (c) for a project with a total project
24 cost greater than six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local
25 government shall contribute thirty percent of the total project

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1 cost; and

2 (5) in determining the sufficiency of a local
3 government's matching contribution, the department shall
4 consider actual funds, in-kind contributions, preconstruction
5 design and development costs and other related expenditures
6 made in the furtherance of the project. Matching fund sources
7 may be any money available to the local government for the
8 project, including:

9 (a) grants or loans by the authority
10 from the local transportation infrastructure fund;

11 (b) appropriations from local government
12 road funds;

13 (c) community development block grants;

14 and

15 (d) available federal funds.

16 D. Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsections
17 B and C of this section:

18 (1) up to a total of twenty-five million
19 dollars (\$25,000,000) shall be distributed from the fund in
20 fiscal years 2007 through 2010 for the acquisition of rights of
21 way, planning, design and construction of drainage and paving
22 improvements and transportation infrastructure improvements
23 related to the spaceport in Sierra county and Dona Ana county,
24 which shall be funded from the fund without a requirement for a
25 local match and which shall have the highest funding priority;

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1 and

2 (2) up to five hundred thousand dollars
3 (\$500,000) of the fund may be expended by the department of
4 transportation for engineering and design services to develop
5 the projects funded with distributions from the fund.

6 E. Earnings from investing the fund may be
7 distributed by the authority to the department of
8 transportation to be used for payment of administrative costs
9 associated with the fund, including payment for engineering
10 costs.

11 F. As used in this section:

12 (1) "fund" means the severance tax
13 transportation fund; and

14 (2) "local government" means a municipality
15 acting within its planning and platting jurisdiction, a county
16 or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo."

17 Section 3. PROJECTS AUTHORIZED FOR DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE
18 SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND.--Pursuant to the provisions
19 of Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978, upon certification by the
20 department of transportation that the need exists for a
21 distribution from the severance tax transportation fund and
22 pursuant to the requirements of that section, the following
23 amounts are appropriated to the department of transportation to
24 be distributed for the following purposes:

25 1. eight million dollars (\$8,000,000) for

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1 acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and construction
2 of roadway drainage, paving and intersection improvements,
3 including landscaping, for Unser boulevard south of Central
4 avenue in the city of Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

5 2. five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for Rio Bravo
6 interchange improvements in Bernalillo county;

7 3. five million six hundred thousand dollars
8 (\$5,600,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
9 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements on
10 Edith boulevard between Candelaria road and Montano road in
11 Bernalillo county;

12 4. three million three hundred sixty thousand
13 dollars (\$3,360,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
14 planning, design and construction of roadway, safety and paving
15 improvements, including signalization of intersections on
16 Fourth street, in the village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque in
17 Bernalillo county;

18 5. three million two hundred thousand dollars
19 (\$3,200,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
20 and construction of a new roadway east of the city of Roswell
21 in Chaves county;

22 6. one million one hundred twenty thousand dollars
23 (\$1,120,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
24 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements of
25 local streets in the town of Dexter in Chaves county;

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1 7. two million eight hundred forty-one thousand
2 five hundred twenty dollars (\$2,841,520) for acquisition of
3 rights of way, planning, design and new construction of roadway
4 drainage and paving for west College boulevard extension from
5 north Sycamore avenue west to the Roswell relief route in the
6 city of Roswell in Chaves county;

7 8. three million five hundred ten thousand dollars
8 (\$3,510,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
9 and construction of new bridge and roadway drainage and paving
10 improvements for a railroad grade separation bridge connecting
11 bureau of Indian affairs roads 30 and 36 in the Pueblo of Acoma
12 in Cibola county;

13 9. five hundred nine thousand four hundred dollars
14 (\$509,400) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
15 and construction of roadway and drainage improvements on C-41,
16 Pie Town road and south Bloomfield road to the Ramah high
17 school complex in Cibola county;

18 10. one million three hundred sixty thousand
19 dollars (\$1,360,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
20 planning, design and construction of roadway, drainage and
21 bridge improvements on east Roosevelt avenue in the city of
22 Grants in Cibola county;

23 11. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the
24 acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and construction
25 of ramps and access roadway improvements to the route 66 casino

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1 in the Pueblo of Laguna in Cibola county;

2 12. nine hundred twelve thousand dollars (\$912,000)
3 for the acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and
4 construction of roadway and drainage improvements, including
5 curbs, gutters and sidewalks, on Pinon drive in the village of
6 Milan in Cibola county;

7 13. three million six hundred thousand dollars
8 (\$3,600,000) for the acquisition of rights of way, planning,
9 design and construction of roadway drainage and paving
10 improvements for reconstruction and rehabilitation of roads
11 within the Ramah chapter of the Navajo Nation in Cibola county;

12 14. one million two hundred thousand dollars
13 (\$1,200,000) for the acquisition of rights of way, planning,
14 design and construction of roadway drainage and paving
15 improvements to Back Basin road in the village of Angel Fire in
16 Colfax county;

17 15. four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000)
18 for rights of way, planning, design and construction of roadway
19 and drainage improvements to resurface streets in the village
20 of Cimarron in Colfax county;

21 16. six hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
22 (\$675,000) for planning and inventory of all county roads and
23 construction of roadway improvements for various county roads
24 in Colfax county;

25 17. one million six hundred thousand dollars

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1 (\$1,600,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
2 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements to
3 south Tomboy drive and Willow Creek drive in the village of
4 Eagle Nest in Colfax county;

5 18. three million two hundred thousand dollars
6 (\$3,200,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
7 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements at
8 various locations in the city of Raton in Colfax county;

9 19. four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for
10 acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and construction
11 of roadway drainage and paving improvements, including
12 lighting, curbs and gutters, medians and sidewalks, for Maxwell
13 avenue and Railroad avenue in the town of Springer in Colfax
14 county;

15 20. two million one hundred sixty thousand dollars
16 (\$2,160,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
17 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements on
18 Prince street in the city of Clovis in Curry county;

19 21. one million four hundred fifty-six thousand
20 dollars (\$1,456,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
21 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
22 paving improvements to county road 4 from United States highway
23 70 to New Mexico highway 348 in Curry county;

24 22. five hundred fifty-eight thousand dollars
25 (\$558,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design

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1 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements
2 for reconstruction of Seventeenth street for access to Airport
3 Industrial road in Fort Sumner in De Baca county;

4 23. one million two hundred thousand dollars
5 (\$1,200,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
6 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements of
7 Tortugas Arroyo Dripping Springs crossing in Dona Ana county;

8 24. four million five hundred sixty thousand
9 dollars (\$4,560,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
10 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
11 paving improvements at the intersection of Telshor boulevard
12 and Lohman avenue in the city of Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

13 25. three million seven hundred sixty thousand
14 dollars (\$3,760,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
15 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage, paving
16 and widening of Anapra road in the city of Sunland Park in Dona
17 Ana county;

18 26. seven hundred twenty-nine thousand dollars
19 (\$729,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
20 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements
21 for east Herrera road in the village of Hatch in Dona Ana
22 county;

23 27. one million three hundred twenty thousand
24 dollars (\$1,320,000) for acquisition of rights of way,

13 roads, including but not limited to Main, north Franey, south

15 31. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for planning,
16 design and construction of roadway drainage and paving
17 improvements to resurface Diaz avenue and Carrasco avenue in

20 (\$2,400,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design

12 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements,
13 including but not limited to roadway widening, curbs and

16 36. eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) for
17 acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and construction
