21	core curriculum frameworks to provide high quality curricula in

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1 a curriculum that is aligned with state (1) 2 academic content and performance standards and that is 3 challenging, specific as to content and sequential from grade 4 to grade, similar to a core curriculum sequence; 5 in-depth professional development for (2)teachers that includes vertical teaming in content areas; and 6 7 content, materials and instructional (3) 8 strategies or methodologies that current research demonstrates are likely to lead to improved student achievement in pre-9 10 advanced placement and advanced placement coursework in grades 11 seven through twelve. 12 C. The framework may be selected from previously 13 developed curricula or may be developed by the school district 14 or charter school. 15 A school district or charter school that meets D. 16 department eligibility requirements may apply to [the 17 department] eastern New Mexico university for support of its 18 core curriculum framework. Applications shall be in the form 19 prescribed by the [department] university and shall include the 20 following information: 21 (1) a statement of need; 22 goals and expected outcomes of the (2) 23 framework; 24 (3) a detailed description of the curriculum 25 to be implemented; .166227.1 - 2 -
