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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
18	"Capital Projects Act".
19	Section 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
20	A. The legislature finds that:
21	(1) the cost of needed state and local capital
22	improvement and infrastructure projects annually exceeds the
23	available funding resources;
24	(2) it has become difficult to adequately
25	evaluate and prioritize proposed capital outlay projects to
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2 cost-effective manner; and

(3) the current system for evaluating andprioritizing proposed capital outlay projects could be improvedby delegating those functions to a coordinating council.

B. The purpose of the Capital Projects Act is to create a council of experts to evaluate and prioritize proposed statewide and local capital outlay projects and to monitor and oversee projects authorized by the legislature to ensure that appropriations are expended in the most cost-effective manner.

Section 3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Capital Projects Act:

A. "capital project" means repair, renovation or construction of a facility; purchase of land; acquisition of capital equipment of a long-term nature; and repair, renovation or construction of roads and water and wastewater systems; and

B. "council" means the capital projects council. Section 4. CAPITAL PROJECTS COUNCIL--CREATION--APPOINTMENT.--

A. The "capital projects council" is created. The council shall consist of the following members:

(1) six members appointed by the governor, whomay be cabinet secretaries or public members;

(2) the state engineer or the state engineer's
designee;

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1 (3) the secretary of higher education or the 2 secretary's designee; 3 (4) the executive director of the New Mexico 4 municipal league or the executive director's designee; 5 (5) the executive director of the New Mexico association of counties or the executive director's designee; 6 7 (6) the executive director of the New Mexico 8 finance authority or the executive director's designee; and 9 one member, appointed by the governor, (7) 10 representing Indian nations, tribes and pueblos. 11 Β. The members appointed by the governor serve at 12 the pleasure of the governor. If the governor appoints public 13 members, they must have expertise in capital financing, 14 planning or construction. 15 The council shall elect a chair and such other C. 16 officers that it deems necessary. The council shall meet at 17 the call of the chair, not less than quarterly. Public members 18 of the council may receive per diem and mileage pursuant to the 19 Per Diem and Mileage Act. 20 Section 5. CAPITAL PROJECTS COUNCIL--POWERS--DUTIES.--21 The council may: Α. 22 (1) subject to legislative appropriation, 23 appoint and employ such professional, technical and clerical 24 assistance as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of 25 the Capital Projects Act; .166378.1 - 3 -

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1 (2) enter into those contracts necessary to 2 carry out the provisions of the Capital Projects Act; 3 conduct research and studies to improve (3) the planning and prioritizing of capital projects and the 4 5 allocation of available resources; apply for and receive grants and accept 6 (4) 7 gifts, donations, bequests and devises in the name of the state 8 to carry out the provisions of the Capital Projects Act; 9 appoint such committees and subcommittees (5) 10 as necessary to perform its duties; and 11 (6) adopt rules necessary to carry out the 12 provisions of the Capital Projects Act. 13 The council shall: Β. 14 prepare an annual operating budget for (1) 15 submission to the legislature; 16 after July 1, 2008, accept proposals for (2) 17 capital projects, prioritize the proposals and, by December 1, 18 2008 and each year thereafter, make recommendations to the 19 legislature for funding the prioritized projects; 20 coordinate all planning, oversight, (3) 21 monitoring and reporting functions of state government 22 regarding capital projects authorized by law. All agencies, 23 institutions, instrumentalities and political subdivisions of 24 the state shall assist the council in complying with this 25 requirement. The provisions of this paragraph do not apply to: .166378.1

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1 (a) capital projects funded pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act; 2 3 (b) capital improvements funded pursuant 4 to the Public School Capital Improvements Act; and 5 (c) capital projects authorized by legislation enacted after July 1, 2008 that specifically 6 7 exclude the capital project from the provisions of the Capital 8 Projects Act; 9 (4) develop criteria and procedures for 10 evaluating and prioritizing proposals for capital projects; and 11 (5) develop such reporting requirements for 12 capital projects as necessary to ensure that the projects are 13 being implemented in a cost-effective manner and consistent 14 with the original purpose of the legislation providing for the 15 project. 16 Section 6. CAPITAL PROJECTS PRIORITIZATION .--17 A. After July 1, 2008, any agency, political 18 subdivision, instrumentality or institution of the state may 19 submit a proposal for a capital project to the council. Each 20 proposal shall contain: 21 a detailed description of the proposed (1)22 project; 23 (2) an explanation of the need for the 24 proposed project; 25 (3) a description of the prime beneficiaries .166378.1 - 5 -

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1 of the proposed project; 2 (4) the estimated total cost of the proposed 3 project and an explanation of how the cost was derived; 4 (5) the amount and source of any other 5 funding; an explanation of how the project will be 6 (6) 7 implemented and maintained and the amount and source of estimated implementation and maintenance costs; and 8 9 any other information required by rule of (7) 10 the council. 11 Β. Upon receipt of a proposal, the council shall 12 investigate the statements and facts contained in the proposal 13 and shall conduct such site visits and hearings as it deems 14 necessary. The council shall consider all proposals and, after 15 a public hearing, shall list all proposals in order of 16 priority. 17 Section 7. TEMPORARY PROVISION .-- During fiscal year 2008, 18 the capital projects council shall organize and perform its 19 duties pursuant to the Capital Projects Act; except that the 20 council shall not accept and prioritize proposals and make 21 recommendations to the legislature until after July 1, 2008. 22 The council shall submit to the second session of the forty-23 eighth legislature the criteria and procedures for evaluating 24 and prioritizing proposals and the reporting requirements 25 developed pursuant to the Capital Projects Act together with

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any recommendations of the council for proposed legislation. Section 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of Sections 1 through 6 of this act is July 1, 2008. - 7 -[bracketed material] = delete .166378.1

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
