nonviolent felony offense or a misdemeanor criminal offense specified in the Criminal Code, convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or convicted of driving while the person's driver's license is suspended or revoked pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Code. Α county's program shall comply with guidelines established by the administrative office of the courts. 7

As a condition of probation, the district or **B**. magistrate court may require the defendant to pay a fee of not less than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) nor more than thirty dollars (\$30.00) per month to the county for the term of [his] Money collected by the county <u>the defendant's</u> probation. pursuant to this subsection shall be used only to operate the misdemeanor and nonviolent felony compliance program.

C. As used in this section, "nonviolent felony offense" means a felony offense in which the offender did not apply force, threaten the use of force or use a deadly weapon in the commission of the offense."

Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2007.
