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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. A new Section 27-6-18.1 NMSA 1978 is enacted

19	"27-6-18.1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PROHIBITION ON DISCONTINUANCE
20	OR DISCONNECTION OF UTILITY SERVICE DURING THE WINTER HEATING
21	SEASONMINIMUM PAYMENTSPAYMENT PLANSEXCEPTIONS
22	A. Except as provided in Subsections C and E of
23	this section, unless requested by the customer, no utility
24	shall discontinue or disconnect service to a residential
25	customer during the heating season for nonpayment of the
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1 customer's utility bill, if: 2 (1) the customer has been qualified to receive 3 assistance pursuant to the low-income home energy assistance program by the administering authority during the program's 4 5 current season; and 6 (2)the customer enters into one of the 7 following payment options selected by the customer and the 8 customer agrees to: 9 (a) pay: 1) a minimum of twenty-five 10 percent of the customer's current charges for each month during 11 the heating season in addition to any assistance provided by 12 the low-income home energy assistance program that has been 13 applied to the customer's utility bill; and 2) past due charges 14 in monthly installments in addition to the current monthly 15 charges due based on a monthly payment plan entered into with 16 the utility; or 17 (b) pursuant to a budget payment plan 18 with the utility approved by the public regulation commission 19 in which the customer agrees to pay an equal amount each month 20 throughout the year. 21 In regard to the option set forth in Β. 22 Subparagraph (a) of Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this 23 section, a monthly payment plan shall require that the 24 customer: 25 (1) pay the past due charges from the

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customer's utility bills in full before the beginning of the 2 next heating season; and

3 (2) pay for continued utility service during 4 the nonheating season.

C. In regard to the payment option set forth in Subparagraphs (a) and (b) of Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section, if the customer does not pay the past due charges from the customer's utility bill from the prior heating season before the beginning of the next heating season, the customer shall not be eligible for protection from discontinued or disconnected utility service pursuant to this section during that next heating season until the past due charges are paid in full.

D. A customer who has defaulted on the customer's chosen payment plan and whose utility service has been discontinued or disconnected during the nonheating season can be reconnected and maintain the protection afforded by this section by paying reconnection charges, if any, and by paying the amount due pursuant to the payment plan by the date on which service is reconnected.

The prohibition on the discontinuance or Ε. disconnection of service pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall not apply in a heating season for which the state does not provide money to the human services department for the low-income home energy assistance program in an amount at least .167323.1

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1 equal to funds received from the federal low-income home energy 2 assistance program in the prior fiscal year.

3 If a customer notifies the utility that the F. 4 customer needs payment assistance and if the customer requests, 5 the utility shall promptly report the customer's request for 6 assistance to the administering authority. The administering 7 authority shall take prompt action to evaluate the customer's 8 eligibility for the low-income home energy assistance program.

Utilities subject to this section shall make the G. 10 following information available to the public regarding:

the low-income home energy assistance (1)program's: (a) application forms; requirements for qualifying for the (b)

program;

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(c) procedures for making an

application; and

location to which an application may (d)

be submitted; and

the protection against discontinued and (2) disconnected service set forth in this section for customers seeking assistance paying utility bills during a heating season, including:

> (a) payment options; and circumstances under which (b)

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1 disconnection or discontinuance of service may occur. 2 н.
