- (4) one member to be elected for a term of four years by the members of the New Mexico education association;
- (5) [one member to be elected for a term of four years by the New Mexico members of the American association of university professors] the chief financial officer of a four-year state institution of higher education appointed by the governor; and
- (6) two members to be appointed by the governor for terms of four years each.
- In the initial composition of the board, [the member elected by the members of the American association of university professors shall serve for a term of three years] one member appointed by the governor shall serve for a term of two years; and the other member appointed by the governor shall serve for a term of one year.
