AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSURE; CHANGING THE SCOPES OF PRACTICE; REVISING REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE; AMENDING AND ENACTING SECTIONS OF THE COUNSELING AND THERAPY PRACTICE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 61-9A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 49, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-9A-5. SCOPES OF PRACTICE.--

A. For the purpose of the Counseling and Therapy 11 Practice Act, a person is practicing as a professional mental 12 health counselor, professional clinical mental health 13 counselor, marriage and family therapist, professional art 14 15 therapist, registered independent mental health counselor, registered mental health counselor, licensed mental health 16 counselor, licensed associate marriage and family therapist, 17 alcohol and drug abuse counselor, alcohol abuse counselor, 18 drug abuse counselor or substance abuse associate if the 19 20 person advertises, offers to practice, is employed in a position described as professional mental health counselor, 21 professional clinical mental health counselor, marriage and 22 family therapist, professional art therapist, registered 23 independent mental health counselor, alcohol and drug abuse 24 counselor, alcohol abuse counselor, drug abuse counselor or 25

1 substance abuse counselor associate, or holds out to the 2 public or represents in any manner that the person is 3 licensed or registered to practice as a counselor or therapist enumerated in this section in this state. 4 5 B. "Practice of professional clinical mental 6 health counseling" means the application of mental health, psychotherapeutic and human development principles through a 7 therapeutic relationship to: 8 achieve the mental, emotional, physical, 9 (1) social, moral, educational, spiritual or career-related 10 development and adjustment of the client throughout the 11 client's life; 12 diagnose, evaluate, prevent and treat 13 (2) mental, emotional or behavioral disorders and associated 14 15 distresses that interfere with mental health; (3) conduct appraisal, assessments and 16 evaluations to establish treatment goals and objectives; and 17 plan, implement and evaluate treatment (4) 18 plans using counseling treatment interventions and 19 strategies. 20 C. "Practice of professional art therapy" means 21 the licensed practice of counseling or therapy services to 22 individuals, families or groups, of services that use art 23 media as a means of expression and communication to: 24 (1) achieve the mental, emotional, physical, 25 SB 494 Page 2

1 social, moral, educational, spiritual or career-related 2 development and adjustment of the client throughout the 3 client's life; diagnose, evaluate, prevent and treat 4 (2) 5 mental, emotional or behavioral disorders and associate 6 distresses that interfere with mental health; conduct appraisal, assessments and 7 (3) 8 evaluations to establish treatment goals and objectives; and plan, implement and evaluate treatment 9 (4) plans using counseling or therapy treatment interventions and 10 strategies. 11 "Practice of marriage and family therapy" means 12 D. the licensed practice of marriage and family therapy services 13 delivered to persons, couples and families treated singly or 14 15 in groups within the context of family systems to: 16 (1)achieve the mental, emotional, physical, social, moral, educational, spiritual or career-related 17 development and adjustment of the client throughout the 18 client's life; 19 20 (2) diagnose, evaluate, prevent and treat mental, emotional or behavioral disorders and associate 21 distresses that interfere with mental health; 22 conduct appraisal, assessments and (3) 23 evaluations to establish treatment goals and objectives; and 24 (4) plan, implement and evaluate treatment 25

plans using marriage and family therapy treatment interventions and strategies.

E. "Practice of licensed professional mental health counselor, licensed mental health counselor, registered independent counselor and licensed associate marriage and family therapist under an appropriate clinical supervisor" consists of rendering counseling services, which may include evaluation, assessment, consultation, diagnosing, development of treatment plans, case management counseling referral, appraisal, crisis intervention education, reporting and record keeping to individuals, couples, families or groups as defined by rule.

The scopes of practice of alcohol and drug 13 F. abuse counseling, or both, consists of rendering treatment 14 15 and intervention services specific to alcohol and other drug use disorders to persons, couples, families or groups. The 16 services may include evaluation, assessment, diagnosis of 17 chemical abuse and chemical dependency disorders only, 18 consultation, development of treatment plans, case 19 20 management-counseling, referral, appraisal, crisis intervention, education, reporting and record keeping. 21 Nothing in this scope of practice shall be construed as 22 preventing licensed alcohol and drug abuse counselors from 23 providing screening and referrals for mental health 24 disorders. However, assessment, treatment and diagnosis for 25 SB 494

such disorders is not within the scope of practice of this license. The practice of these activities will be limited to the individual's level of training, education and supervised experience. The alcohol and drug abuse counselor may provide therapeutic services that may include treatment of clients with co-occurring disorders or dual diagnosis in an integrated behavioral health setting in which a multidisciplinary team has developed a multidisciplinary treatment plan that is co-authorized by an independently licensed counselor or therapist. The treatment of a mental health disorder must be supervised by an independently licensed counselor or therapist.

The scope of practice of a substance abuse 13 G. associate under the supervision by an appropriate supervisor 14 15 is limited to supervised work in a public or private institution. The associate may be involved in taking social 16 histories or conducting home studies. The associate utilizes 17 the basic problem-solving process of gathering information, 18 assessing that information at a beginning professional level 19 20 and developing an intervention plan. The associate may implement the plan and conduct follow-ups pertaining 21 specifically to alcohol and drug abuse counseling. The 22 associate may provide client education and assist a licensed 23 counselor-therapist with group or individual counseling 24 25 sessions. A substance abuse associate shall not practice

1 independently as a private practitioner."

Section 2. Section 61-9A-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 49, Section 13, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-9A-13. PROFESSIONAL ART THERAPIST--REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE.--

The board shall issue a license as a 6 Α. professional art therapist to a person who files a completed 7 8 application accompanied by the required fees and who submits 9 satisfactory evidence that the applicant:

has reached the age of twenty-one; (2) demonstrates professional competency by 11 passing an examination as prescribed by the board; 12

holds a master's or doctoral degree in 13 (3) art therapy, counseling or counseling-related field from an 14 15 accredited institution or nationally approved art therapy program with a total of no less than forty-eight graduate 16 semester hours or seventy-two quarter hours in the art 17 therapy core curriculum; 18

meets the art therapy core curriculum as 19 (4) 20 defined by rule;

has completed a minimum of two years (5) 21 post-graduate professional experience, three thousand client 22 contact hours and one hundred hours of post-graduate 23 face-to-face experience under appropriate supervision. 24 Seven hundred clinical client contact hours may be from the 25 SB 494

1 applicant's internship or practicum program beyond the 2 requirements in Paragraph (3) of this subsection. 3 Supervision shall be under a New Mexico-licensed professional art therapist or certified board therapist for at least fifty 4 5 percent of the working hours; and is of good moral character with conduct 6 (6) consistent with the code of ethics. 7 8 Β. Effective July 1, 2005, applicants must meet the art therapy core curriculum, as defined by rule." 9 10 Section 3. Section 61-9A-14.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1999, Chapter 161, Section 15, as amended) is amended to 11 read: 12 "61-9A-14.2. ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELOR--13 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE. -- Effective July 1, 2005, the 14 15 board shall license as an alcohol and drug abuse counselor a person who files a completed application accompanied by the 16 required fees and who submits satisfactory evidence that the 17 applicant, as defined by rule: 18 Α. is of good moral character with conduct 19 20 consistent with the code of ethics; B. has reached the age of twenty-one; 21 С. demonstrates professional competency by passing 22 the required examinations prescribed by the board; and 23 has one of the following combinations of 24 D. 25 education and experience:

1 (1) an associate degree in counseling, a 2 counseling-related field or a substance abuse-related field 3 from an accredited institution, and education and training that includes two hundred seventy-six clock hours with ninety 4 5 hours in each of the fields of alcohol and drug abuse counseling, six hours of professional ethics, three years and 6 three thousand client contract hours under appropriate 7 supervision of experience in the practice of alcohol and drug 8 abuse counseling and two hundred hours of face-to-face 9 supervision; 10

(2) a baccalaureate degree in counseling, a 11 counseling-related field or a substance abuse-related field, 12 as defined by rule, from an accredited institution and 13 education and training that includes two hundred seventy-six 14 15 clock hours with ninety hours in each of the fields of 16 alcohol and drug abuse counseling and six hours of professional ethics, two years and two thousand client 17 contact hours under appropriate supervision of experience in 18 the practice of alcohol and drug abuse counseling and one 19 20 hundred hours of face-to-face supervision; or

(3) a master's degree in counseling, a
counseling-related field or a substance abuse-related field,
as defined by rule, from an accredited institution, and
education and training that includes two hundred seventy-six
clock hours with ninety hours in each of the fields of

1 alcohol and drug abuse counseling and six hours of 2 professional ethics, one year and one thousand client contact 3 hours under appropriate supervision of experience in the practice of alcohol and drug abuse counseling and fifty hours 4 5 of face-to-face supervision hours." Section 4. A new Section 61-9A-14.3 NMSA 1978 is 6 7 enacted to read: "61-9A-14.3. ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELOR--8 REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANDFATHERED LICENSURE.--9 10 Α. Effective July 1, 2007 through July 1, 2010, the board shall license as an alcohol and drug abuse 11 counselor a person who holds a current certified alcohol and 12 drug abuse counselor certification issued between 13 July 1, 1996 and July 1, 2010 and files a completed 14 15 application accompanied by the required fees and submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant: 16 is of good moral character with conduct 17 (1)consistent with the code of ethics; 18 has reached the age of twenty-one; 19 (2) 20 (3) has submitted evidence of having participated in a total of six thousand client contact hours 21 and three hundred supervised face-to-face hours; and 22 (4) has completed two hundred seventy-six 23 clock hours of education or training that includes ninety 24 hours in each area of the fields of alcohol and drug abuse 25
